The BEST PALS program provides early intervention services to families with a child having behavioral or developmental concerns from infancy to age 5-11 years. The program offers personalized parenting education, and assessment & intervention for the developmental / behavioral concerns of the child, and access to parenting resources. Weekly visits for up to 3 months by educators trained in early childhood development and education and/ or specialist in the areas of speech and language, physical therapy, sensory integration and occupational therapy. We focus on the child's abilities, strengths and needs, and teach parents methods to help the child gain the necessary school readiness skills. Referrals to other services, physicians or agencies are made when needed.

CASA volunteers are appointed by a judge to discover the best possible outcome for an abused or neglected child's future. It is the goal of the CASA volunteer that every one of these children receive the care and services they need to thrive and to see them placed in a safe, loving, forever home. A CASA volunteer is often the most stable adult in an abused child's life. Volunteers come from all walks of life and are trained to review records, research information and talk to everyone involved in the child's life: social workers, attorneys, judges, parents, teachers, family members and, of course, the children themselves, who benefit from having a consistent, caring adult mentor and role model. CASA volunteers who receive additional specialized training also serve infants and toddlers. CASA Mentors serve young adults who have left foster care and asked for a mentoring relationship to help then as they begin their adult lives.

Program Description: Promote accessible quality early learning experiences for children by building our county's capacity to serve children in child care and by providing educational opportunities including group training, consultation and on-site technical assistance. Individualized guidance through the family child care licensing process is provided at no cost. Training and technical assistance typically cover child growth and development, health and safety, and the business aspects of child care.

The Prevention and Early Intervention Program is a specialized training that enable us to partner with privately funded child care centers and family child care homes to build problem solving, social, emotional and behavioral skills for children between the ages of two and six.

Program Description:

The Child Development Resource Center of the Central Coast (CDRC) is a nonprofit organization and community program providing child development and therapy programs to strengthen families. CDRC has earned special commendations as an exemplary early prevention and intervention program from the California State Department of Education for our unique "wrap around" child development/mental health and family services, and for outstanding community support and involvement in the program. CDRC also works in partnership with families by involving them as the most important people in their children's lives and basing the program on their needs. Overall, we hope to assist children and families in their efforts to have positive, meaningful, and healthy family relationships. In addition to our full-day child care and therapy program for children ages 2 to 5, we also provide a school readiness/transition program for children entering kindergarten. Our professional staff provides family counseling, group & individual play therapy for children, administration of our child nutrition program, which provides 80% of each child's daily nutritionals needs.

Preschool -The Child Development Resource Center is a non-profit organization providing child care to children ages 2-5. We accept applications throughout the year and begin our year-long program each July. Tuition for our program is just \$750 per month for full-time students (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) or \$450 for part-time students (8:30 a.m. to noon). Daily full and part time rates are also available. Both programs include breakfast and lunch, and full-time children also receive an afternoon snack. Extended hours are feasible with advance notice. Scholarships and financial aid are also available for families who qualify.

Therapy – The primary purpose of play therapy sessions is to provide individual time and attention and to facilitate communication with each child. Our specially equipped play therapy rooms provide a space where the child can feel free to communicate through play their feelings, safety issues, and social conflicts. The therapist facilities communication to the child through the play medium an image of the child's worth, appropriate social interactions, and self-survival skills. The atmosphere encourages trust and helps the non-disclosing child toward disclosure when appropriate. The program helps the child build a positive image of self, the world, and his/her own family. The program counteracts the message often given to children who can not yet understand the complex relationships in the world, "don't feel, don't trust, and don't talk."

Individual therapy is provided for children, teens, and adults who are able to verbally communicate their thoughts and feelings. Sessions can include one or more people in the family, and decisions are made about the course of treatment throughout the time seen with the client on an ongoing basis. Program Description:

Local private pediatricians who accept Medi-Cal and the pediatricians and providers at Community Health Centers of the Central Coast provide CHDP Health Assessment and immunizations. Children 0-21 yrs. eligible for CHDP services are from lowincome families or have Medi-Cal (CenCal). If the children have Medi-Cal (CenCal) they also have Denti-Cal.

- Provides free physicals and oral health assessments at or below 266% of the Federal Poverty line, to help children stay healthy, find health problems early, and receive referrals to specialists.
- Offers well child examinations that focus on disease prevention for infants, children and teens; also available for school entry, sports/camp physicals and foster care placements.
- Includes a complete health history, head-to-toe physical exam, nutrition information, vision and hearing tests, immunizations, tuberculosis (TB) tests, lab tests, and health education.

The County CHDP Administrative unit facilitates the implementation of State Standards and Guidelines, and assists families in locating providers and making appointments and assisting parents establish a dental home.

Program Description:

Community Counseling Center is a non-profit organization that provides short-term, low-cost, professional counseling for individuals, couples and families who would not otherwise be able to afford it. Most clients have no insurance and a low to moderate income. Volunteer counselors see children, adolescents, and adults of all ages with a variety of problems, including: anxiety, depression, eating disorders, marital and family issues, parenting, gay/lesbian issues, anger, grief, phobias, stress, and transitional issues that can be helped by short-term counseling. We have no walk-in clinic for emergency situations nor do we address chronic mental health problems.

Fees: Services are typically fee based, on a sliding scale according to each client's net household monthly income and ability to pay. Additionally, CCC now accepts CenCal/Medi-Cal insurance coverage through a partnership with the Holman Group, a private managed care agency contracted by CenCal to implement the Affordable Care Act Mental Health benefit. The CenCal/Medi-Cal benefit is available to individuals (no couples or family) with "mild to moderate" issues and can be utilized for longer term treatment based upon medical necessity. CCC coordinates a panel of over 20 agency providers that are credentialed by the Holman Group to provide therapy to the Medi-Cal/CenCal population on the Central Coast. The benefit typically offers clients full coverage without any out of pocket co-pay required. In some instances clients have forms of Medi-Cal that only offer shared cost coverage.

Eligibility: Community Counseling Center provides services to children, adolescents, and adults of all ages with a variety of problems including: anxiety, depression, eating disorders, marital and family issues, parenting, gay/lesbian issues, anger, grief, phobias, stress, and transitional issues that can be helped by short-term counseling. We do not have a walk-in clinic for emergency situations nor do we address chronic mental health problems whose conditions are not appropriate for short-term counseling such as: substance abuse, sexual abuse, domestic violence, custody cases and chronic mental illness.
