Three broad project types are supported: sustaining cultural heritage, supporting lifelong learning, serving as centers of community engagement. This is a 1-to-1 matching grant.

NEH is the largest U.S. funder of humanities programs; it often funds cultural institutions such as museums, archives, libraries, colleges, public television, radio stations and individual scholars. Eligible projects strengthen teaching and learning in the humanities in schools and colleges across the nation, facilitate research and original scholarship, and preserve and provide access to cultural and educational resources.

Grant funds are administered by the Federal Highway Administration, and are provided on a cost-reimbursement basis with the maximum federal share topping out at 80-percent. Projects must be located on, along, or associated with, a designated byway. Eight eligible project categories: state and tribal programs; corridor management plan; safety improvements; byway facilities; access to recreation; resource protection; interpretive information; and marketing.
