BELMONT, CA – On January 26, the MPWD proudly acknowledged the winners and participants of its 9th Annual Water Awareness Poster Contest while also unveiling the 2017 MPWD Water Awareness Calendar that prominently features twelve of the top entries. The Poster Contest is conducted each year to promote water awareness with local third- through fifth-grade school children, in the hope of encouraging early habits centered around water conservation. Poster artwork was based on the Water Awareness Calendar theme, "If Everyone Saves a Little, We Can All Save a Lot!"

83 poster entries were submitted from local schools, notably Immaculate Heart of Mary School, Cipriani Elementary School, and Nesbit Elementary School. All participants were invited to the January Board of Directors Meeting, where winner and participation awards were presented.


"The Water Awareness Poster Contest is a wonderful outreach to the local community," says MPWD President Al Stuebing.
