GENERAL RULES

1. This competition is American Homebrewers Association (AHA) sanctioned and open to amateur homebrewers age 21 or older, **who reside in either San Luis Obispo or Santa Barbara county.**
2. Please indicate the proper class when registering the style of beer to ensure proper judging.
3. Registration is to be done online <https://cmsfw.fairwire.com/>
4. Entries must be received between the dates allotted. Any entry received after the deadline will not be judged or returned.
5. This competition uses [BJCP Style Guidelines \(2021\)](#). Consult the guidelines to determine the best fit for each entry.
6. Please fill out the entry forms completely. Be meticulous about noting any special ingredients that must be specified per the guidelines. Failure to note such ingredients may impact the judges' scoring of your entry.
7. Each entry consists of two (2) up to 12 oz. bottles that are devoid of all identifying information, including labels and embossing. Cans will also be accepted. Printed caps are allowed, but must be blacked out completely.
8. 12oz brown glass bottles are preferred; however, green and clear glass will be accepted. 12- and 16 ounce cans will also be accepted. Large format bottles and swing-top bottles will not be accepted. Bottles will not be returned to contest entrants.
9. Print out entry receipt and rubber band around each bottle accordingly. **NO LABELS** or other distinctive markings (embossed bottles, etc) may be used on bottles or cans. Non-compliant entries may be rejected.
10. Six (6) Entries maximum per Exhibitor, and no more than two (2) entries per class. Limited to the first 75 entries registered.
11. Due to health and safety regulations, upon submission to the contest, all entries become the property of the California Mid-State Fair and not returned to entrant.
12. The competition organizers are not responsible for mis-categorized entries, mailed entries that are not received by the entry deadline, or entries that arrived damaged.
13. The competition organizers reserve the right to combine styles for judging as needed depending upon the quantity and quality of entries.
14. Score sheets will be mailed to exhibitors with ribbons (if applicable) in a timely manner after the judging.
15. Each exhibitor can purchase up to TWO (2) \$7 one-day admission tickets. They are to be purchased during registration. Tickets will be mailed to you in early July. They can be used by anyone and are nonrefundable.
