Permit Modification for Transfer of Ownership

**AUTHORIZATION TO DISCHARGE UNDER THE NATIONAL POLLUTANT
DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT**

In accordance with the substantive and procedural requirements of the Federal Clean Water Act, 40 CFR Section 122.61(b) and/or 40 CFR Section 122.63(d) and the Massachusetts Clean Waters Act, as amended (M.G.L. Chap. 21 Sections 26-53), the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") and the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection ("MassDEP") acknowledge the transfer of ownership and coverage under the permit number MA0003654 from Brayton Point Energy, LLC to:

Brayton Point LLC, is authorized to discharge from the facility located at Brayton Point Station, One Brayton Point Road, Somerset, MA 02725 to Mount Hope Bay (Mount Hope Bay Basin, MA61-06, 61-07) in accordance with effluent limitations, monitoring requirements and other conditions set forth in the permit issued on February 29, 2012 and modified on September 2, 2014. The effective date of the transfer of ownership and authority to discharge is January 19, 2018.

The original permit to discharge and the 2014 modification expired on May 13, 2017. However, since a timely application was filed, the permit has been administratively continued pursuant to 40 CFR §122.6, 48 Fed. Reg. 14158, April 1, 1983.

The original permit consists of 21 pages in Part I; 1 page in Attachment A – "Chemicals Used"; 21 pages in Attachment B – "Marine Acute Toxicity Test Protocol and Procedures, September 1996" and "Marine Chronic Test Protocols and Procedures 1996"; 6 pages in Attachment C – "Ambient Monitoring Locations"; and 25 pages in Part II General Conditions and Definitions, January 2007 and the modification dated September 2, 2014. These conditions remain in effect for the new owner.
