PE and Sports Funding Impact 2016 – 2017

Redesdale Primary School has utilised its PE and Sports Grant this year to ensure children receive effective teaching of a high quality PE curriculum and the further development of new sporting and playtime opportunities. This has increased the children's interest and engagement with the PE curriculum, a range of new sports and supported the work of our Ambassadors. We feel it is essential to encourage children to become involved in sports and physical activities, as well as participating in extra-curricular clubs and taking part in competitions.

Outline of Expenditure	Cost	Impact of 2016 - 2017 spending
Hoops 4 Health Roadshow – Newcastle Eagles	£525	Developing Year 5 & 6 children's health awareness and developing new inter competitions through the Eagles basketball competition. The basketball club ran as after school club. Our team reached the final at Northumbria University Sports Central again but lost in a sudden death shoot out.
White Lines on the grass	£200	From April, North Tyneside Council provided white lines for a 4 lane 70metre sprint and a 1 lap 120 metres. This encouraged children to be more active a break times and also provided the basis of an improved Sports Day.
Transport for Competitions	£315	Transportation for pupils to take part in tournaments including the Swimming Gala and Skipping events which are continuing to develop positive attitudes and engagement in participating in different sports. Children are much more confident to take part in sports events.
PE Equipment	£667	New PE storage trolley's to store gymnastics mats in the sports hall. Improved storage and usability to move mats from the Main Hall and Sports Hall for staff and children. The Sports Hall is now safer to use as the mats can be removed easily to enable the whole hall to be used and to provide a safer environment. A class set of skipping ropes has also been purchased for children to train in skipping.
Skipping Festivals	£400	Year 4 are much more active outside with most purchasing their own skipping ropes. Redesdale entered the festival and achieved personal medals for achievement. Much more skipping is taking place on the yard and children are teaching each other new skipping techniques. Our children won the local final and were runners up in the regional final.
Match Fit	£350	Children in Year 3 are much more aware of the importance of healthy eating, how they can take care of their bodies through fitness and by what they eat. A report from Northumbria University shows the results before and after the course.
Write Dance	£62	Write dance has been introduced in Early Years to improve children's gross motor skills. As this was only introduced in Summer 2 it is too early to assess its impact, but the early signs are encouraging as children take part in the new activities.
Contribution to Outside Gym	£1,800	Extended opportunities for children to participate in extra activities during Golden Time and playtimes. All classes have been shown how to use the equipment safely by their Class Teacher.
Replacing soft surface in Foundation Unit outside area	£1,850	EYFS children are able to safely use the outdoor area and climbing equipment at all times, with the replacement of the new soft surface. Our children are able to be more active in a safe environment.
