

To review a course for transfer credit we require a B or better grade in the course, a course syllabus, and samples of coursework. All courses must be completed at an accredited institution.

**Transfer students can be exempted from a maximum of three Core Seminars.*

SCI-Arc Course	Examples of Acceptable Equivalents
Introduction to Design Cultures	Design History, History of Furniture Design, History of Interiors, Design Appreciation
Introduction to Film	Film/Cinema Studies, Literature courses that include film
Forms of Writing I	Any college-level writing course
Forms of Writing II	Critical Analysis/Writing, Intermediate Composition
Race in America	Ethnic Studies, Race Theory, Socio-Political Studies
Art History I	Art History from Prehistory to 1900, Humanities from Prehistory to 1900, Art Appreciation
Art History II	Art History from the 20th Century to Contemporary, Art Theory
*Core Seminar I: Contemporary	Any survey course on contemporary philosophy or contemporary literature.
*Core Seminar II: 20th Century	Any survey course on 20th-century philosophy, 20th-century literature, or any Physics course that covers both quantum theory and general relativity.
*Core Seminar III: Modern Era	Any survey course on 19th-century literature that covers writers from more than one country, or any survey course on 19th-century philosophy that covers at least three different authors.
*Core Seminar IV: Medieval Era	Any course on Medieval European, Medieval Jewish, or Medieval Arabic civilization.
*Core Seminar V: Ancient Era	Any course on Ancient Greek, Ancient Roman, Ancient Chinese, or Ancient Hindu civilization.
Liberal Arts Elective (3 courses)	Any course in social science, natural science, or applied science
History of Architecture I	Architecture survey course covering Prehistoric to Renaissance
History of Architecture II	Architecture survey course covering Renaissance to 1945
History of Architecture III	Architecture survey covering 1945 to Present
