Enclosed please find San Luis Obispo County Air Pollution Control District Notice of Violation Number 2963, issued for failure to comply with District Rule 1001, Coastal Dunes Dust Control Requirements and Rule 402, Nuisance as follows:

## Rule 1001, Sections C.2, F.1.f and F.1.g

Failure to maintain and operate a control site monitor, and Section C.3 for exceeding the PM10 concentration limits.

### Rule 402

Discharging or allowing the discharge of quantities of air contaminants (Particulate matter) which has caused injury, detriment, nuisance or annoyance to a considerable number of persons or to the public.

Please advise the Air Pollution Control Officer in writing on or before June 26, 2017, of corrective action taken and measures taken to prevent further violations of this type. Upon receipt of your response the District will contact you regarding settlement of this violation.

# What will happen once you have received a NOTICE OF VIOLATION?

#### A NOTICE OF VIOLATION IS HANDLED BY THE DISTRICT IN ONE OF THREE WAYS:

- 1) MUTUAL SETTLEMENT: The Mutual Settlement Program is designed to eliminate litigation for companies and individuals who rarely violate the District rules and who have corrected the problem before any action has been brought by the District. If a mutual settlement is sought you will be notified by mail generally within one month of receiving a Notice of Violation, after your notification to the District of corrective action on the violation and measures taken to prevent further occurrences.
- 2) CIVIL ACTION: In some cases a civil action is filed by the District. If a civil action is filed, you may be found liable for up to \$50,000 per day per violation (Health and Safety Code Section 42402.3). A civil action is usually brought within six months after the Notice of Violation is issued.
- 3) CRIMINAL PROSECUTION: If a criminal action is filed, the case is referred to the District Attorney for prosecution. At this point, the case is out of the District's hands. All fines are determined by the court system with a maximum fine of \$50,000 per day and/or one year in jail for each violation (Health and Safety Code Section 42400.3). Typically you will receive a notice of criminal complaint within ninety days of receiving the Notice of Violation. If a criminal case is filed against you, you will be required to make an appearance for arraignment to make a plea of guilty, not guilty, or nofo contendre. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS CONCERNING PENALTIES OR PROCEDURES, YOU SHOULD SEEK THE ADVICE OF YOUR ATTORNEY.
