Ms. Rohan:

I have lived on the Nipomo Mesa for the past 8 years and suffer from reduced lung capacity due to air pollution from the ORV State Park Dunes. I find it hard to believe that the ACPD is unable to correct this problem!

- 1. We deserve clean air now.
- 2. The proposed abatement order is essentially the same as the previous one which is woefully deficient and unsatisfactory.
- 3. The Hearing Board needs to act to provide immediate relief to the residents of the Mesa. A significant reduction should be required up front, not employed piecemeal over five years. We have been waiting for eight years and enough is enough.
- 4. The Hearing Board should direct the immediate closing of the most emissive 200 acres now.
- 5. The Hearing Board should order that the 200 acres be fully vegetated by September 1, 2018.
- 6. The Hearing Board should order the restoration of a fully vegetated berm area by September 1, 2018.
- 7. The Hearing Board should measure the results and if 200 acres doesn't reduce the pollution level by 50%, then order the closing of another 100 acres by April 1, 2019.
- 8. The Hearing Board should stipulate fines for non-performance.
