Alyssa,

I am disappointed in the revised abatement order agreed to between State Parks and the APCO. Specifically;

- The proposed abatement order is not significantly different than the previous abatement order which was deemed by the Hearing Board to be inadequate
- The Hearing Board should act to provide immediate relief to the residents of the Mesa; the current proposal is little change up front with promises to come. "Hockey Stick" models don't work, we need real relief now
- The most emissive 200 acres of the part should be closed to ATV use immediately and the closed acreage be fully vegetated not later than September 1, 2018
- The berm area should also be fully vegetated not later than September 1, 2018
- Measurement of pollution levels should remain active; if the 200 acre closure does not reduce pollution levels by 50%; another 200 acre closure should be completed by April 1, 2019
- There should be fines and penalties for failure to meet stipulated emissions reductions.

This is a very serious matter that the residents of the Mesa regard as critical to our lives. You are the Air Pollution Control District; not the ATV Recreational Society. Your sole role is to ensure air quality for the residents of San Luis Obispo County and not to promote recreational activity predominately accessed by residents from outside the community. A properly constructed and monitored abatement order can work both ways; to provide ATV recreation without impinging upon the health and welfare of the citizens who breathe this air 24/7.
