To Alyssa Roslan for the APCD board:

Eight years have passed with no significant effort to protect our health from egregious pollution by airborne dust on the Nipomo Mesa. Now we are supposed to read, evaluate, and respond to this much delayed third attempt at a Stipulated Agreement in less than a week?!

First and foremost, nothing should be approved without immediate relief for the long-suffering citizens on the Mesa. An agreement must start with major reductions immediately. After eight years of inaction, all state and county agencies involved are culpable. This foot dragging is indefensible.

Mitigation of 100 acres in 2018 would be a minimum acceptable start, followed by 100 additional acres in 2019 and again in 2020. This is expected to reduce the ongoing perennial damage to resident's health by nearly half, which is little enough especially considering the gross misconduct by state parks to date. Mitigation in the out years should be completed by the end of March when the windy season commences and so many of us begin struggling once again to breathe through the spring and early summer months.
