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**Subject:** APCD Hearing Board on Monday  
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At the March 21 Hearing Board the Board directed Parks and the APCO to come back with a plan that was much more aggressive in reducing the air pollution than what was presented at that meeting. The new proposed Stipulated Agreement between State Parks, the APCD and the California Air Resources Board that has been published is a huge disappointment. This new Stipulated Agreement only has very nominal changes ignoring the direction of the Board. The residents of the surrounding and downwind communities deserve clean air now.

I would request that the Hearing Board reject this Stipulated Agreement and act to provide immediate relief to the residents of the surrounding and downwind communities. It has been eight years with no relief. Please direct the closing of the most emissive 200 acres immediately with vegetation restored within 12 months. The results of this action should be measured and if the pollution level hasn't been reduced by 50% additional acreage should be closed in 2019 to achieve the 50% pollution reduction. Fines should be stipulated for non-performance - State Parks needs incentive to achieve the directive!

The California Air Resources Board and other experts already know what needs to be done. This issue has been studied to death. We need immediate relief from this air pollution.
