The charter of the Air Pollution Control District Hearing Board should be to provide clean air for residents.

- The Hearing Board should review the testimonies by Dr. Campbell (County Health Officer) and Dr. Heading at the March 21, 2018 Hearing Board meeting They are independent medical experts.
- Dr. Campbell's data showing a life reduction of 9 weeks for a 3 microgram increase in PM2.5 is scary. Note for 15,000 residents that corresponds to <u>2,600 person-years lost</u> plus reduced health and quality of life.
- Note that there is no safe level of pollution and it is cumulative on the lungs.

Reject the proposed Abatement Order

- At the March 21, 2018 Hearing Board, you directed Parks and the APCO to come back with a plan to produce a 50% reduction in air pollution.
- Parks/APCO didn't do it. They ignored your direction. The draft abatement is a major disappointment. They are trying to kick the can down the road. Their Scientific Advisory Board is just another stall tactic.
- Parks/APCO are back with the same plan that produces according to CARB, produces only a 12% PM10 reduction (cf. page 22). Adding 5% a year will get them to 50% reduction by 2026. Ridiculous.
- A goal of 50% pollution reduction in five years is stated but there is no plan to get there. Certainly 12% in year one is not a good first step. How about 30% year one and 10% in each of year 2 and 3.
- Reject this draft abatement order.

The Hearing Board needs to impose a plan to get clean air now.

- The Hearing Board should direct the immediate closing of the most emissive 200 acres now.
- Order that the 200 acres be fully vegetated by September 1, 2018.
- Order the restoral of a fully vegetated berm area by September 1, 2018.

- Measure the results and if 200 acres doesn't reduce the measured pollution level by 50% then order the closing of another 100 acres by April 1, 2019.
- Stipulate fines for non-performance
- State that the OHV riding is causing a nuisance.
