To the APCD Hearing Board:

Prior to the October 14 APCD meeting, I would like to submit the following for your consideration:

- The Stipulated Order of Abatement process exists for a fundamental reason: Particulate matter from the dunes remains a critical public health issue. More and more studies demonstrate how detrimental particulate matter exposure is to the human body.
- Therefore, any change that reduces the compliance target from a 50 percent reduction to a 40.7 percent reduction should be rejected out of hand.
- The proposed work plan includes 59 acres of dust mitigation in the WSP/CLT (plover) nesting enclosure. This, too, must be rejected. The State Parks proposal should not be approved since the area is an Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Area.
- Any proposed extension of the Stipulated Order of Abatement term is unacceptable since it would delay compliance with state air quality standards, extending the associated health hazards to us all who live and work in SLO County.

Please take care of the people of this county, most especially those of us who live and work in the Oceano Dunes/Nipomo Area.
