As an RN who worked in cardiopulmonary critical care for eight years, and other medical positions involving pulmonary and cardiac disease, I am appalled at the irresponsible actions, or lack of meaningful action, of the Air Pollution Control Officer and the Off-Road Highway Vehicle Division of State Parks. It's my understanding that an abatement order with pathetic goals and no plans to implement them is under consideration.

Obviously, the "Officer" and ORV State Parks division are more interested in monetary gain and satisfying ORV constituents than the health of local citizens who have to live with this abhorrent air pollution. Those ORV enthusiasts get to go back home to better air than what they leave us to breathe here at our homes.
