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TMHA RECEIVES OPPORTUNITY TO THRIVE GRANT FROM COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Grant will fund employment opportunities for homeless adults with mental illness.

SAN LUIS OBISPO, CA – Transitions-Mental Health Association (TMHA) has received a \$5,000 grant from the Community Foundation of San Luis Obispo's Opportunity to Thrive Grant Program. This grant will be used to expand the agency's current Supported Employment Program to create a special day labor division that would provide services targeted for our homeless and chronically homeless clientele. The objective of this new Supportive Day Labor Program would be to create a first step towards employment, reintroducing our homeless clients to the work world.

Participating clients would be selected from TMHA's Transitional Housing for the Homeless and Permanent Supported Housing programs. Clients participating in the Supported Day Labor Program will receive work shifts suited to their ability and interests; training in vocational skills and work readiness; the option to enter TMHA's Supported Employment Program and receive Job Coaching, Job Development, Benefits Counseling, Job Readiness Training, and Vocational Assessment; and a job and a paycheck.

A \$5,000 grant will enable TMHA to provide 80-90 3-hour work shifts that will serve 20 people in the course of the grant period. "Our goal," said Joe Madsen, Division Director of Housing and Supportive Services Programs, "is that a majority of our Day Labor clients will treat this first, low-stress step as a bridge to TMHA's Supported Employment Program and continue to seek steady work as part of their path to recovery."

Through a testamentary gift, former Mayor of the City of San Luis Obispo, Ron Dunin, and his wife Helen established an endowment to help people who are attempting to help themselves. As immigrants, the Dunins were fortunate to receive help and support during critical times in their lives. Their goal by creating the fund was to give back to the community and assist San Luis Obispo county residents in need. Grants from the "Opportunity Fund" are intended to support individuals striving for self-sufficiency and who are in need of transitional assistance to overcome a **short-term or one-time barrier**.
