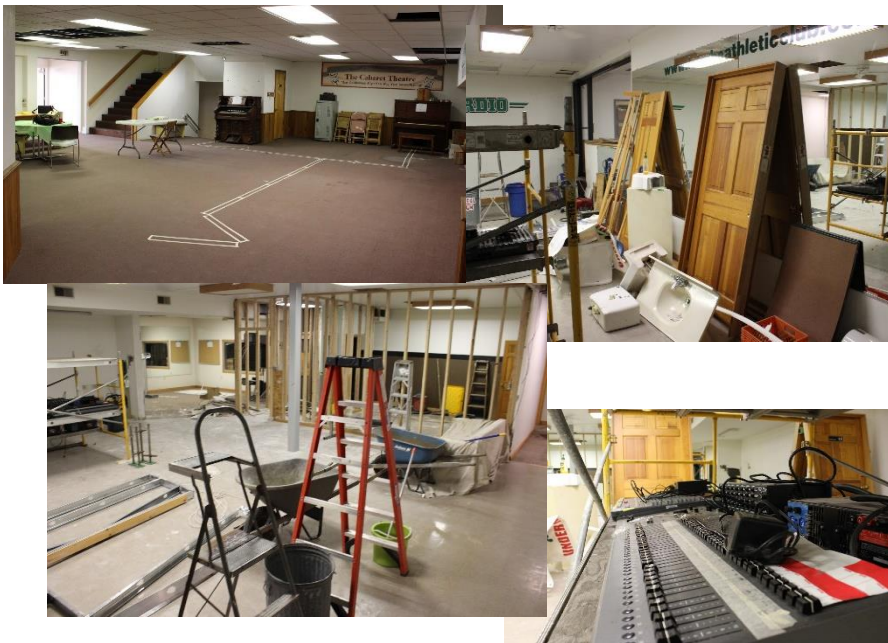

THE CABARET THEATRE IS SEEKING TALENT!

"There are two ways of going about developing a theater season," says John J. Carosella, Artistic Director for the American Performing Arts Theatre Company and President of The Cabaret Theatre, Inc. "You can pick the show you want to do and hope that the right people will show up to fill the available roles well, or you can assess what talent you have and then pick a season to suit the talent. I think the second choice makes for stronger productions."

To that end, The Cabaret Theatre and its resident acting company, American Performing Arts Theatre Company, will hold a general talent search auditions on three consecutive days in October. On Saturday and Sunday (October 10 & 11) open auditions will be held from Noon till 5:00 P.M. And on Monday (October 12) they will be held from 7:00 till 9:00 P.M. All of the auditions will be held across the street at The Latrobe Art Center.

When asked what specific kind of talent he was looking for, Carosella responded that he was interested in seeing all kinds of talent from any age group—young children to senior citizens. "There are hundreds and hundreds of excellent plays that I would like to produce and knowing what the talent pool is like enables me to pick and choose what is best for the kinds of actors we have." The auditions will be for both musicals and non-musical plays. All who audition may choose to present a prepared monologue or do a "cold reading" which will be provided by the Theatre Company. Those who wish to audition for musicals are asked to prepare at least 16 measures of a song that they thing demonstrates their singing ability. The Theatre Company will provide the accompanist. Those who audition must provide their own sheet music.
