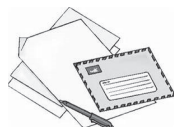

SAINT OF THIS WEEK: ST. GREGORY THE GREAT

The Patron Saint of Teachers

St. Gregory, born at Rome about the year 540, was the son of Gordianus, a wealthy senator, who later renounced the world and became one of the seven deacons of Rome. After he had acquired the usual thorough education, Emperor Justin the Younger appointed him, in 574, Chief Magistrate of Rome, though he was only thirty-four years of age.

After the death of his father, he built six monasteries in Sicily and founded a seventh in his own house in Rome, which became the Benedictine Monastery of St. Andrew. Here, he himself assumed the monastic habit in 575, at the age of thirty-five.

After the death of Pelagius, St. Gregory was chosen Pope by the unanimous consent of priests and people. Now began those labors which merited for him the title of Great. His zeal extended over the entire known world, he was in contact with all the Churches of Christendom and, in spite of his bodily sufferings, and innumerable labors, he found time to compose a great number of works. He is known above all for his magnificent contributions to the Liturgy of the Mass and Office. He is one of the four great Doctors of the Latin Church. He died March 12, 604. He is the patron of teachers.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION: "The fire of goodness within"

"Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Nelson Mandela, the first president of democratic South Africa, was imprisoned for more than 20 years for his opposition to the racist government. Despite the horror of those years, both for himself and for black South Africans living under the brutal apartheid system, Mandela, as president, did not preach hatred and revenge. In his autobiography, **Long Walk to Freedom**, Mandela recounts how he was able to survive prison by finding the spark of humanity in the guards:

"I always knew that deep down in every human heart, there was mercy and generosity. No one is born hating another person because of the color of his skin, or his background, or his religion. People must learn to hate, and if they can learn to hate, they can be taught to love, for love comes more naturally to the human heart than its opposite. Even in the grimmest times in prison, when my comrades and I were pushed to our limits, I would see a glimmer of humanity in one of our guards, perhaps just for a second, but it was enough for me to keep going. Man's goodness is a flame that can be hidden but never extinguished."

As Jesus makes clear in today's Gospel, the kind of human beings we are begins in the values of the heart, the place where God dwells inside of us — but the evil we are capable of, the hurt we inflict on others, the degrading of the world that God created also begins "within," as well: when God is displaced by anger, hatred, selfishness, and greed. May God open our spirits and consciences to listen to the voice of God speaking in that sacred space within every heart, calling us to understanding instead of judgment, forgiveness instead of vengeance, respect instead of ridicule, reconciliation instead of division.

WHY DO MORE PEOPLE JOIN ST. JOHN'S?

The answer, according to many new parishioners, is that people feel they have found a spiritual home here! Even if you are not a member, but if you have been attending Mass here, you will have realized that already. Registered parishioners receive a few periodic mailings of information about activities and events that will augment the sense of belonging through participation. Being a member enables you to say "YES!" when someone asks you to be a Godmother or a Confirmation Sponsor. As Father Abraham said last week at Mass, heaven is not a geographic place – but it is a conscious state of union with God in our hearts, beginning in the here and now into eternity. So why not become a member of this spiritual home here at St. John's?

SNAPSHOT OF 2014 BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL

The Diocese has sent us a detailed report about 2014 BAA and projections and plans for 2015 BAA. Here's a SNAPSHOT of the 2014 BAA

Through the generous support from our diocesan faith community, through June 30, 2015, the Appeal

- Raised \$6,760,875 = 99.4% of the \$6.8M goal
- Received \$6,581,416 (97.3% remittance on amount pledged to date)
- Received 25,322 gifts to date = 8% attrition rate (vs. 27,583 gifts to 2013 BAA)
- Realized an average pledged gift amount of \$267, a 6% increase over the average gift last year.

And our Community of St. John Neumann is one of the few parishes that contributed above the 90% mark (ours was 92.6%)
