We see it every time we go to church. A sign prominently placed on the way into our church proclaiming Every Member a Minister. It is our mission to be a minister for Jesus. It's a mission we shouldn't take lightly. It's a big responsibility! So, what does this really mean? How can we be better ministers for Jesus? It's not difficult. To me, it's simple,

Spread the Word

There is a very good book that Father asked the Pastoral Council and Church employees to read. It's called Rebuilt. I'm sure you may remember Father talking about it. I highly recommend it. In particular, there is a chapter that made me think differently about how we can be better ministers to Jesus. The chapter is called "Lost People in Churchworld". "Lost People" are those that are no longer following Jesus. It is our job to help them to find their way. Part of our Parish Goal is to "Welcome All Segments of Our Larger Community". Do we really do that? Do we sometimes simply focus on the Larger Community that we envision? Do we really mean ALL? There is an excerpt from Father Michael in the book that reads,

"After Mass, in the lobby, I was approached by one of our Eucharistic ministers. She shouted in my face, 'It makes my blood boil to see *that* in church.' *That* turned out to be a young man, dressed in black denim, sporting multiple tattoos and piercings, a really interesting hair color and, I think, mascara. Everyone, including the young man, heard her. The message from all our 'ministers' was very clear. This was *their* church..."

So, being a minister can mean going outside of your comfort zone. Instead of keeping your radio frequency on one particular station, think more like a scanner. Keep your eyes and ears open for opportunities to "Spread the Word". If your heart and senses are open to it, you may find ways to truly welcome ALL segments of our larger community and help the lost. It may deepen your faith too by awakening the minister in you.

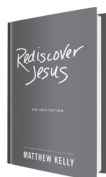
Please know that we keep you in our hearts and prayers and thank you with all our hearts. May the blessings of the Christmas season be with you all.

Excerpt from Rediscover Jesus, Chapter 17 Radical Relationships

"Jesus completely rejected the social norms of the day when he chose the people he spent time with. And I suspect he would do the same if he were alive today. What does that each us about the people we spend our time with?"

There are two lessons here for us. First, we all need a group of people to do life with – people who walk with us through the good and the bad, who encourage and challenge us to be the-best-version-of-ourselves.

Second, Jesus made a habit of going out of his way to engage people on the fringe of society. He didn't spend all his time with them. He had his close friends and inner circle. The point is he never avoided people on the edge of society, and in fact even willingly encountered them.

Where are these people in your life?

The Gospels are an invitation to explore all of life, to get beyond the comfortable center of life and explore the margins. The parts of life we avoid and ignore are the very parts that Jesus was most interested in. The types of people we avoid and ignore are the type of people Jesus was most interested in."

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Baptism of the Lord

**And a voice came from heaven. "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."
Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22**

*Steven Spielberg's political thriller **Bridge of Spies** is based on the true story of James Donovan, an attorney who became an unlikely but remarkably effective diplomatic and political negotiator during the tense years of the Cold War.*

Bridge of Spies

Donovan is a New York insurance lawyer. In 1957, he is tapped by the bar association to take on the thankless task of representing accused Soviet spy Rudolf Abel at his espionage trial. A conviction is all but assured - but the government wants to show the world that American justice doesn't railroad anyone. So they assign Donovan, an insurance lawyer rather than an experienced defense attorney, to make sure that the legal process is followed to the letter. Donovan reluctantly agrees to represent Abel.

But Donovan does a better job than expected, and manages to spare his client the death penalty. Donovan will go on to negotiate a prisoner swap with the Russians: Abel for an American U-2 pilot shot down over the Soviet Union.

In the course of the trial, a CIA agent approaches Donovan. The CIA wants to know if Abel has revealed anything to Donovan about his contacts. Donovan refuses to violate the lawyer-client privilege. The agent smirks, "Don't go Boy Scout on me. We don't have a rule book here."

Donovan responds, "You're Agent Hoffman, yeah?"

The agent replies, "Yeah."

"German extraction?"

"Yeah, so?"

"My name's Donovan - Irish, both sides. But what makes us both Americans? Just one thing - one, one, one - the rule book. We call it the Constitution, and we agree to the rules. And that's what makes us Americans. It's all that makes us American, so don't tell me there's no rule book . . ."

The irony is that in a country so obsessed with preserving the "American Way," Donovan is the only one actually living it.

In *Bridge of Spies*, James Donovan is both "claimed" and "called." God's Spirit of justice and wisdom has "descended" upon him, compelling him to seek what is just and good for all - and he has been "called" to use his considerable talents and skills to forge pathways of peace during one of the most dangerous times in history. In baptism, we, too, are both claimed and called by God: God "claims" us as his own people: a people of peace, justice and compassion; and he "calls" to the work of realizing his vision, his "Kingdom" that Jesus reveals. Today's feast of Jesus' baptism challenges us to renew our baptismal vow to respond to that call and claim - in every decision we make, in everything we do - that we are disciples of the Jesus of the Gospel of justice, reconciliation and servanthood.

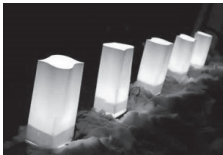
BEREAVEMENT SEMINARS AT ST. JOHN'S

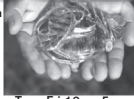
