FROM A PARISHIONER'S DESK...

*"Taste and see, taste and see
The Goodness of the Lord,
O taste and see. Taste and see,
The goodness of the Lord...of the Lord"*



Having been a parishioner at the Catholic Community of St. John Neumann for 17 years, I periodically think back to our entrance into this Catholic Community and my first talk with Father Bill Mickiewicz:

Nancy and I entered into the Catholic Community of St. John Neumann in August of 1998 anxious to see if my second son would receive a proper religious education that my prior church's CCD program was not giving him. He was coming home upset at the lack of class management that was giving him anything other than a rewarding experience in learning about his faith. Father Bill interviewed both of us as to our motivations for coming to this Catholic community, and I immediately expressed all the positives of what a family friend, a current member of St. John's back then, had said to me about the enriching religious education program her children were receiving at St. John's which had prompted our exit from our preceding parish.

"I certainly would want that for him above all," I said to Father Bill. "But Steve, I understand you are a public school teacher during the work week. We happen to be in need of CCD instructors with our CCD year about to begin. It sounds like you, a good Catholic, would be a perfect fit to give your son and others that religious education you seek by coming here," said Father Bill Mickiewicz. And that's when I knew I had stepped into a trap! I took my first challenge in this parish and said, "Well, that does make sense, Father Bill (because backing out of that offering would have been so cowardly at that point)! I can do that if the church needs it." It was my first of many "taste and see" moments in this faith community, and, with Nancy at my side for every class, I did teach eleven seventh graders in St. John Neumann's CCD program, including son John, that autumn of 1998. We laugh about how Father Bill deftly employed our services for St. John's that August afternoon right after our Discovery Sunday experience. That CCD experience opened up socialization to so many others for us, young and old, in that first year. I thank Susan Schessler, the SJN Director of Religious Education back in 1998, for forwarding that socialization.. That August afternoon opened the door to the variety of volunteer programs and the people that headed them...most that still exist at SJN in 2015!

Yet, it is what our parish is all about for all that choose to "taste and see." It is part sacrifice...part exploration in my view. Sacrifice is what so many of our scripture stories about Jesus and the Jewish people are all about, and with much more risk, historically, than my previous CCD anecdote! With risk comes reward, and with so many programs at St. John Neumann that parishioners can be involved in, it would be a crime not to "taste and see!" The exploration part, once you're involved, is left up to you!

If you have been a St. John's parishioner for five years or less, and you have not gotten involved in any aspect of the program life at St. John Neumann, maybe this message is for you! "Taste and see, taste and see, the Goodness of the Lord, O, taste and see, taste and see, the Goodness of the Lord...of the Lord!"

Excerpt from *Rediscover Jesus*, Chapter 28 Spontaneous Prayer "GOD DELIGHTS IN CONVERSATION WITH YOU"

We spoke already about a time dedicated to prayer each day. The second aspect of our daily conversation with God is the spontaneous turning to him during moments of the day to thank him, to ask him for help, guidance, encouragement, or simply to recognize him at our side."

"The daily casual conversation with God tends to be kept alive by the focused time of prayer each day. When we neglect our daily prayer time, the casual conversation becomes less frequent. If we neglect our daily time of prayer for long enough, the casual conversation throughout the day will die out almost entirely, the exception being those astounding moments of life that force us to our knees. The richness of our spontaneous conversation with God flows from having a time set aside exclusively for prayer each day. This spontaneous prayer can become one of the great joys and comforts of the Christian life."

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

"There was a wedding at Cana of Galilee..."

John 2: 1-11

In her work as a chaplain for the Maine Warden Service and her life's role as a spouse and mother and now grandmother, Kate Braestrup has experienced life at its most traumatic, chaotic, and terrifying - as well as life at its most fulfilling, affirming and joyful. In her new memoir

Anchors and Flares: A Memoir of Motherhood, Hope and Service, she writes:

"If the three stages of man are optimism, pessimism, and cynicism, I think I'm going through them in reverse order. I was more cynical when I was younger, and every year brings me closer to optimism.

"It was easier to be cynical about men before I married one and had my sons.

"It was easier to be cynical about American race relations before my brother adopted my darling African-American nephew, and my son received [after the death of my husband] fathering from men of every hue.

"It was easier to be cynical about crime and punishment before I worked with cops, easier to be cynical about war and peace before my son joined my father's [Marine] Corps, and downright easy peasy to be cynical about the future before I had a grandson on his way into it.

"These days, cynicism seems uncomfortably close to despair, and I no longer believe that the only alternative to despair is blind denial . . . Bad things happen but the world isn't ending. No bang, no whimper, no sudden fix, just this long, slow slog we're all taking together toward the next shining inevitable miracle."

In his "first sign" in the Gospel of John, Jesus transforms simple water into the choicest wine - it is a fitting sign of what Jesus has been sent by God to do: to transform our world from the brokenness of sin and the deadness of avarice into God's banquet table of generosity, hope and healing. In Christ, the "watered-down wine" of fear and self-centeredness is replaced with the "new wine" of compassion and gratitude for the life God has given us, of honor and respect for every human being as a child of God, of the justice, mercy and peace of God, the Host of the great Wedding Feast.

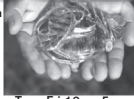
