“GOD DELIGHTS IN CONVERSATION WITH YOU”

“Suppose we are having coffee together and I say to you, ‘Can you go out tomorrow and create just one holy moment?’ Not a holy day, or a holy hour, or even a holy fifteen minutes – just one holy moment.

You will probably ask, ‘What is a holy moment?’

A holy moment is a moment when you are being the person God created you to be, and you are doing what you feel God is calling you to do in that moment.

‘I think I’ve got it,’ you say, ‘but tell me one more time – what is a holy moment?’

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me..."

Luke 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21

The Abbey

In Father James Martin's new novel

The Abbey, Anne is a 40-year-old divorcee whose life is shattered when her 13-year-old son Jeremiah is killed when his bike is struck by a car. Three years after the accident, Anne is still mired in grief.

One evening, Anne's car breaks down and she calls a friend for help. He comes immediately to pick her up, but on the way home he has to stop at a nearby Trappist monastery to retrieve his cell phone that he had left while working there. While waiting, Anne meets Father Paul, the wise, humble and unassuming abbot of the monastery.

It is the beginning of a friendship that helps Anne move on from her debilitating sorrow. Father Paul is generous not only with his time but with sharing his own experiences of doubt and hurt and confusion. He gives Anne a safe place to vent her anger at God for taking Jeremiah from her. Over the course of several conversations, Father Paul, with compassion and without judgment, helps Anne confront her grief by realizing the narrowness of her images of God.

At one of their meetings, Paul asks Anne when she last felt some measure of peace. She replies that she feels happiest when working in her garden as she had that weekend. Strange, she said, "I thought that it felt like God was patting down the soil . . . around me, sort of. Does that sound insane?"

A gentle smile comes to Paul's face.

"Not at all," Father Paul says. "It sounds beautiful. God is the gardener who tends you like a flower, who nourishes you, just as you care for the plants in your garden . . . Can you let that be your image of God for now?"

"That image may be a gift from God. It may be God's inviting you to see things in a new light. Who says that you have to think of God only as a judge? Who says that's the only image you can use? There are lots of images of God. And I think God's just given you a new one."

As Father Paul helps Anne see God in new ways and so begin a new relationship with God, Jesus begins his public ministry in today's Gospel by speaking to his neighbors in his home village about a God who sends him forth to "bring glad tidings" to the poor, liberation to those imprisoned, sight to the blind, freedom for the oppressed. All of us, at one time or another, face the doubt and emptiness experienced by Anne: We struggle to make sense of our lives, to move beyond brokenness and disappointment, to understand why we are even her. The Jesus we will meet in Luke's Gospel will challenge our own images of God, revealing to us a God of compassion and mercy, a God who seeks reconciliation with us always, a God who makes his presence known to us in every act of kindness and moment of healing we experience.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

"Never"

You've probably seen the charming and funny television commercial for State Farm Insurance that portrays, in 30 seconds, the many stages and changes we all experience in life.

In the spot, our "hero" vows "never" to do something, only to do it immediately in the following scene. "I'm never getting married," he says, after spotting an attractive girl at a pool party - but in the next scene, he's buying a ring. And then follows a string of "nevers": never going to have a kid, never moving to the suburbs, never getting a minivan, never having a second kid. But then he does all of those things - and happily, he discovers.

In the final scene, with his wife and daughters snoozing on him in front of the TV, he promises the only "never" he will keep: "I'm never letting go."

The young husband and father discovers what every one of us comes to discover: that the certainties of our childhoods change as we get older, that what we can't imagine in our early adulthood become the things we cherish in our later years, that we realize lasting happiness only we stop seeing ourselves as the center of everything. The one constant in our journeys from "Never" to "Yes" is the Spirit of God: the Spirit that leads us to the other side of doubt; that reveals the love of Emmanuel in our midst; that enables us to heal, to lift up, to transform our lives in the grace and wisdom of God. It doesn't make things easier; it doesn't lighten the hard work of becoming the people God calls us to be - but the Spirit opens our hearts to the possibilities for creating God's Kingdom in our midst: "glad tidings" for the poor, sight to the blind and light to the lost, justice for the oppressed, and peace and hope for all. Whatever gifts and graces we possess can work great and wondrous things when done in the Spirit of God.

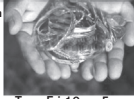
