### Being the big, bad grown-up

In Father James Martin's new novel

A first-year high school English teacher caught a student in an act of blatant plagiarism. The teacher was stunned - she was an excellent student: inquisitive, thoughtful, responsible. But her final paper was a mishmash of her own work with that of someone more famous. The teacher had to report her and let the school's disciplinary process do its work. The teacher, not all that much older than her teenage students, hated playing the big, bad grown-up, but she had no choice. The student was suspended.

The student then came to see the teacher in her office. The teacher braced herself for recriminations and tears. But, instead, what she got was gratitude: "Thanks for caring enough to notice that I did something wrong," the student said. "I appreciate it. I'm glad you were paying attention."

The student's words were exactly what the young teacher wanted to hear and she has carried them down through the years when she struggles to stand firm - especially now that she is a parent herself, the mother of a two-year old. She writes:

"My son is at the age where the world is a grand experiment and each hypothesis must be tested, again and again, to be sure it still holds true. Often, he will reach for stove, knives, or scissors and shout 'No!' as he does so. Then, hand hovering near the forbidden object, he'll look up at me to see what I do. When I say 'No' along with him, he looks pleased. The pleasure, I'm sure, comes not from the boundary, but from the sense that he has figured out something about how the world works. But when there's something new he wants and I say 'No,' his response is not what you might call positive. It's intense, frustrated, primal. He definitely does not thank me for establishing boundaries."

At those moments, she remembers her student of a few years ago and what she learned about having to be the big, bad grown-up: "[it] isn't how good it feels to be thanked by a child, but how thankless it must be, sometimes, to try to be good for a child."

Such "prophetic" actions stretch our patience and cause us anxious second-guessing - but to follow Jesus is to speak and act with integrity, to do what is right and just no matter how unpopular we become. In baptism, we are all called to be prophets of what is good, regardless of the cost such prophesy exacts from us. May we possess the grace to act prophetically with compassion and forgiveness; may we possess the wisdom to respond faithfully to God speaking to us in the example of integrity and faithfulness of the prophets in our lives.**

**"No prophet is accepted in his own native place."**

**Luke 4: 21-30**

### **"The most dangerous man in football"**

Chris Borland was on his way to a dream career in the NFL. With 107 tackles in his rookie season with the San Francisco 49ers in 2014, Chris was going to be star. But his first season playing pro football would be his last.

Chris retired at the age of 24. "What am I doing?" he said to himself. "Is this how I'm going to live my adult life, banging my head, especially with what I've learned and know about the dangers?"

Chris saw how repeated concussions have left thousands of former players racked with debilitating headaches, anger and confusion, and the early onset of dementia. Despite the success of his rookie year, Chris was unwilling to play another season because he was concerned that it would become a trap - he would continue risking injury in pursuit of a paycheck. He didn't want to risk of not being able to play with his own kids someday.

Chris' decision to walk away from football has won the admiration from parents of hundreds of thousands of youngsters eager to play each year at the youth, high school and college levels. But Chris is not without his critics - especially the NFL. The league points to the new protocols it has put in place for players who suffer concussions during games. Others deride Chris as "soft" and accuse of trying to ruin the national game.

Chris willingly returned most of his signing bonus to the 49ers. "That was the biggest surprise for me. People can't get over the money," Chris said. "That's all they think about. But your health is a little more important."

Chris is adamant: the game cannot be made safer as it is now being played and coached and marketed. He's reluctant to even watch the game because he is concerned for his friends and teammates still playing. Chris turned down a role in the new movie **Concussion** and several endorsement opportunities. "I don't want to monetize head injury in football. I think that attacks your legitimacy." Chris has offered himself as a subject for concussion research.

Because of his courageous decision to walk away from fame and fortune in the NFL, ESPN calls Chris Borland the "most dangerous man in football."

**God reveals his Word of love and reconciliation through unexpected "prophets" like Chris Borland who, in their integrity and courage, speak the truths we don't want to hear. Such "prophecy" demands the courage and conviction to confront who we are, to recognize the gulf that often exists between the values we profess and the values we live, and our need for change and re-creation in the justice and mercy of God. Throughout the Gospels and Scripture, many who encounter Jesus and the prophets are unable to hear, accept and act on God's call to change the evil systems that dehumanize them. May we possess the grace to act "prophetically" with love and forgiveness - and the courage to listen "prophetically," willing to risk isolation, criticism and ridicule in order to transform our lives in the justice and mercy of God.**
