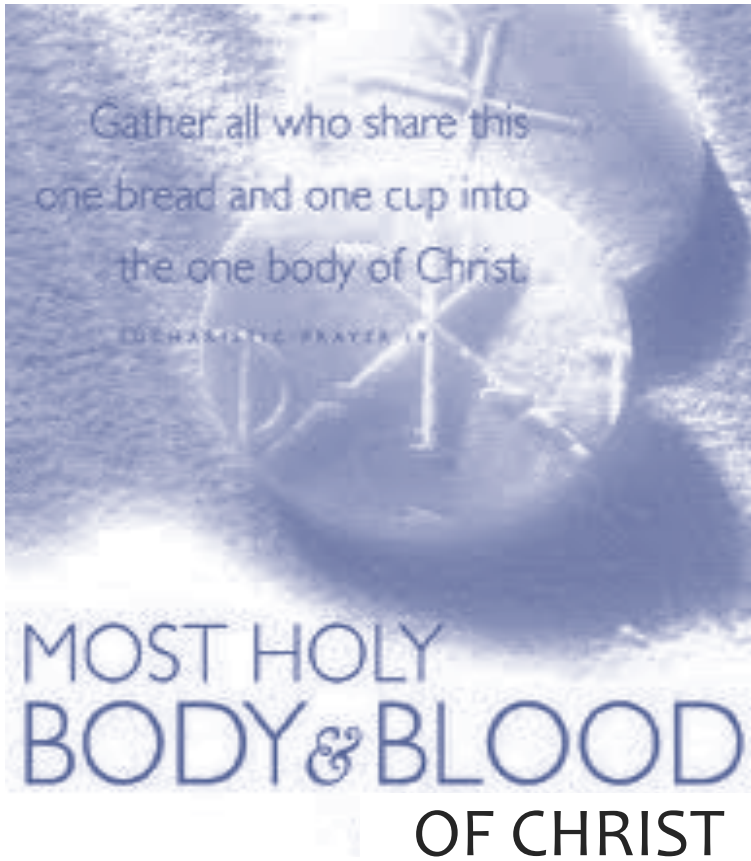

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Friends,

Bishop James Checchio celebrated Mass for the parishes of our Deanery of Round Valley last Monday at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church in Three Bridges. Attended by some four hundred people – including all the priests of the Deanery, the new Shepherd exhorted us to invoke the Holy Spirit in order to have the wisdom and guidance to make the right decisions in our lives. Prior to the Mass, Bishop Checchio held a meeting with all the priests and asked for their input and suggestions regarding pastoral priorities for the Diocese. Thus, in my opinion, he has begun his episcopacy with the right attitude of listening. Let us pray for him that he will be a good shepherd to the People of God of Metuchen Diocese.

This Sunday is the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (more commonly known by its former name: Corpus Christi Feast). It is a powerful reminder of the why of our Sunday Eucharistic gathering: celebration of the Real Presence of Christ in our midst! There are four ways in which Christ is present in the Eucharist: in the gathering of the people because “where two or three are gathered in my name, I am in their midst;” in the presider of the Mass because every priest is acting “in persona Christi” or in the person of Christ; in the Word proclaimed during Mass because it is God’s saving message; and in the Holy Communion because it is the real Presence of Jesus in the sacred species of bread and wine. May this Feast make us more conscious of His Presence at every Eucharistic celebration and appreciate it more.

The coming weekend is an important one for our parish as we hold the main fund-raising event of the year. It is so very gratifying to see the level of participation from so many of us to make this a successful one for the good of the financial health of our parish. Even though it is clear that all cannot be physically present in the evening of Auction, Dinner, Dance, Raffle, Fab-Five, etc., all can participate through different ways, especially by selling the raffle tickets, or 50/50 tickets and a host of other ways. If we have not done any of these, this is the week to think of it and act on it! Due to the Auction set up, our monthly First Friday Holy Hour will be in the Chapel at my residence. Why not come and experience the personal love of Jesus this Friday at 7pm and offer that Holy Hour for the success of the Auction night?

Bring what you grow to the church at harvest time and we'll combine our efforts to make soup mixes for distribution in our holiday food baskets.

TWO SINGLE MOMS IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE

The first lady's name is Tara and we have assisted her a few times now. You might recall about a year ago when we solicited a request for rental assistance and through the generosity of our community we were able to assist her. Tara has three youngsters and until recently was working, but was laid off by her employer. We were able to assist her with a few bills and food cards, but what she really needs is work. She's willing to take on work that involves child care and house cleaning while she continues to look for a more permanent place to work. The second single Mom that requires assistance simply needs all season clothing for her 3 daughters. Sizes are all in the range of: 5-14. VISITING THE SICK AND DISTRIBUTING THEM EUCHARIST

Social Ministry is seeking volunteers to provide visits to the homebound and provide The Eucharist to them. This is a ministry that is very much appreciated by the homebound parishioners. As our community ages we should expect that the demands for these services will be expanded and how fitting it seems that we attempt to expand these services during our Jubilee Year of Mercy. We propose to continually remind the community of this need and then provide a "call to service" where those that discern that this vocation is a calling for them can gather and discuss specifics. We will guide all of you through the practices that will be easy for you and rewarding for the homebound. Remember, your calling may be either for just visiting those who are not able to get out and about or bringing them The Eucharist as a Eucharistic Minister or both.

COMING TO CALIFON A FARMER'S MARKET!

EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION CONVERTED ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON!

Two hundred years ago, a beautiful, young, Episcopalian woman accompanied her husband, a merchant, to Italy, leaving four of their five children at home with family members. They had sailed for Italy, hoping that the change in climate might help her husband, whose failing business had eventually affected his health adversely. Tragically, he died in Livorno. The grieving young woman was warmly received by an Italian family, business acquaintances of her deceased husband. She stayed with them for three months before she could arrange to return to America. The young widow was very impressed by the Catholic faith of her host family, especially their devotion to the Holy Eucharist: their frequent attendance at Mass, the reverence with which they received Holy Communion, the awe they showed toward the Blessed Sacrament on feast days when the Eucharist was carried in procession. She found her broken heart healed by a hunger for this mysterious presence of the Lord, and, upon returning home, requested instruction in Catholic Faith. Soon after being received into the Church, she described her first reception of the Lord in the Eucharist as the happiest moment of her life. It was in St. Peter's Square on September 14, 1975, that Pope Paul VI canonized this woman, Elizabeth Ann Seton, as the first native-born saint of the United States. The Eucharist for her was a sign and cause of union with God and the Church.

REFLECTION CORPUS CHRISTI: *Trade Rumors.*

Jesus feeds the crowd with the five loaves of bread and two fish. Luke 9: 11b-17

An eight-year-old returned home from playing baseball. From the look on his face, it was clear that it had not been a good afternoon. His dad asked what was wrong. "I was traded today," he said sadly. "Well, that's not so bad," his dad said, as upbeat as he could manage. "The pro players get traded all the time." "I know," his dejected son said. "But I got traded for a *glove!*"

Too often we forget that the people we meet and deal with everyday are more than just metrics and statistics, more than just market shares, more than just "human resources" whose only value is in their production or buying power. We can be too quick to label and slot people in broad terms based on nationality, race, culture, or religion. Today's readings challenge us to look beyond demographics and statistical profiles to see individual human beings, men and women and children made in the image of God. May God open our hearts and spirits to see every human being as mirroring the grace of God and afford them the dignity that is all of ours by being created in his likeness and image.

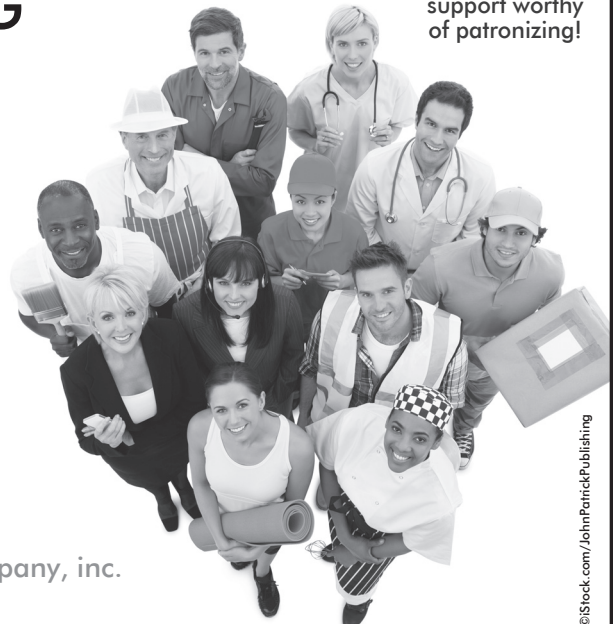
