SOWING SEEDS OF MERCY



*It's time to plant
your seeds!!*

*A few seeds become
warm soup, spreading
mercy, love and com-
passion in the world.*

If you would like to participate in the "Sowing Seeds of Mercy" effort, you will need to **plant your seeds within the next two weeks**, so they will have sufficient time to grow for harvesting this fall. You can plant them in your garden or in a 10" pot, water and watch them grow all summer. Then in the fall, harvest the beans and bring them back (unshelled) to St. John's. The beans will be used to make soup mixes to be distributed in the holiday food baskets. They will also be used to make soup for the SHIP's Galley Soup Kitchen and Elijah's Promise. There are extra seed packets available at the Social Ministry station in the narthex.



4TH OF JULY FOOD CARDS

Each year, St. John's provides generous food baskets for the holidays to our neighbors who are struggling financially. It has long been our tradition to continue this practice during the summer months with some assistance around the 4th of July. We do this by providing about 10 families and 19 individual elderly folks with food gift cards to the local grocery stores. Stop by the narthex after Mass and purchase Shop Rite gift cards in any amount. Use the envelopes at the Social Ministry Station and deposit your donation in the collection box by the table, place it in the collection basket or drop it by the office. Please have all donations in by the weekend of June 25-26.

First of all, a big "THANK YOU" to all who contributed to the collection of the clothing for the 3 little girls. As it often happens, their mom broke into tears of joy when presented with them. This is a joy that I wish could be shared with all of you.

We do have another pressing need that was brought to our attention by another church. We contributed generously to assist a young man living in High Bridge who fell behind in his electric payments and had his electricity shut off. He received help also from NORWESCAP and has contacted a social service agency in Flemington for counseling services. In essence, he is trying to pick himself up, but faced with unemployment finds that at times it is a bit difficult. He still requires \$900.00 to get his utilities in order and we would like to help him in this regard. VISITING THE SICK AND BRINGING THEM EUCHARIST

SUNDAY REFLECTION: FORGIVE MUCH!

Jesus said: "So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." (Luke 7:47)

A young man secretly misappropriated several hundred dollars from the business where he was employed. When the shortage was discovered the senior partner called the young man into his office. Immediately he knew he would be fired and sent into prison. His employer asked the worried man if he was guilty. He replied that he was. Then the executive surprised him. "If I keep you in your present capacity, can I trust you in the future?" he asked. "Yes sir, you surely can. I've learned my lesson," replied the astonished employee. His boss must have detected the repentant man's sincerity. "I'm not going to press charges and you can continue in your present responsibility," he said. Then he added, "I think you ought to know, however, that you are the second man in this firm who succumbed to temptation but was shown leniency. I was the first. What you have done, I did. The mercy you are receiving, I received. It is only the grace of God that can keep us both!"

Isn't it true that those who love best are those who know best that they are loved? Those who forgive best are those who are forgiven. Today's readings are about God's mercy and forgiveness and the need for our loving and grateful response by a renewed life. We need to cultivate a forgiving attitude towards our neighbor: Although it is not easy, we must learn to forgive those who hurt us if we want to be able to receive the daily forgiveness we need from a merciful God. We start forgiving when we try our best to patch up quarrels, misunderstandings and disagreements and pray for the well-being of our offenders.

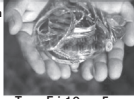

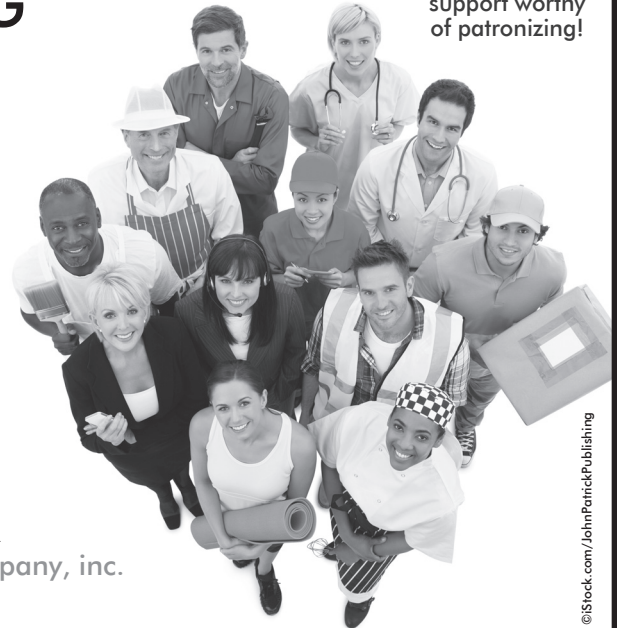
