Dear Friends,

These wonderful parishioners, together with their sponsors, have grown in their faith journey. Similarly, all of us can benefit in our need to grow in faith matters. Those who are participating in the faith sharing sessions in our Project Earth Garden on Wednesday evenings, facilitated by Jo Ann Jarvis, are having a great time enriching their soul while drinking in the beauty of the blossoming garden. Can we enjoy this Summer taking some time to give a treat to our inner life of the soul? St. John Bosco said rightly: "Only God knows the good that can come about by reading one good spiritual book." INTRO TO IGNATIAN SPIRITUALITY

offered by The Prayer Ministry

What is Ignatian Spirituality? Ignatian Spirituality is a unique form of prayer and relating to God using scripture, reflection, contemplation, life events, and imagination. This form of prayer was developed by St. Ignatius Loyola in a body of work known as the Spiritual Exercises. Incidentally, Jorge Bergoglio, who later became Pope Francis, was a member of the Society of Jesus, founded by St. Ignatius, also known as the Jesuits.

Fred Galano, a parishioner and a Religion teacher trained in Ignatian Spirituality invites parishioners to explore this type of prayer. One could learn one or two of the prayer methods in a session, or complete a variation of the Spiritual Exercises which would take a longer amount of time. The time commitment would be discussed with each individual according to their need.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: ARE YOU KIDDING?

"Start each day with an hour of prayer!?? No way!!" A true story is told about an advertising executive at *Reader's Digest*, who found her emptiness filled in by prayer, listening to God, as Mary did in today's Gospel. In spite of her successful career, she had felt emptiness in her life. One morning, during a breakfast meeting with her marketing consultant, she mentioned that emptiness. "Do you want to fill it?" her colleague asked. "Of course I do," she said. He looked at her and replied, "Then start each day with an hour of prayer." She looked at him and said, "Don, you've got to be kidding. If I tried that, I'd go off my rocker." Don smiled and said, "That's exactly what I said 20 years ago." The woman left the restaurant in turmoil. Begin each morning with prayer? Begin each morning with an hour of prayer? Absolutely out of the question! Yet, the next morning she found herself doing exactly that. And she's been doing it ever since. This woman is the first to admit that it has not always been easy. There have been mornings when she was filled with great peace and joy. But there have been other mornings when she was filled with nothing but weariness. And it was on these weary mornings that she remembered something else that her marketing consultant said. "There will be times when your mind just won't go into God's sanctuary. That's when you spend your hour in God's waiting room. Still, you're there, and God appreciates your struggle to stay there."

Today's Gospel reminds us of the need to combine work and prayer. It is a well-known fact that those who are in the caring professions, like doctors, nurses, pastors, social workers and even parents, often suffer from burnout and terminal exhaustion as Martha did. People suffering from burnout often end up angry, anxious, and worried. Hence, occasionally we need to put aside the work we do for the Lord in serving others and just spend some time being with Him, talking to Him and listening to Him, fully aware of His holy presence in our souls. We may do the recharging of our spiritual energy also by our personal and family prayers, by the meditative reading of the Bible and by participating in the celebration of the Holy Mass. Christian husbands and wives should develop "couple spirituality" and seek more opportunities to pray together. The Martha and Mary episode teaches us the need for balance between service and prayer and the need for spending time with the Lord, learning from Him and recharging our spiritual batteries with the power of the Holy Spirit.

CHWC WITNESS TALK BY OUR YOUTH

My name is Hannah Nacamuli. I turned 14 last December and I am currently transitioning into high school. I have been wanting to attend Catholic Heart Workcamp for as long as I could remember, but I was never old enough, so when I was old enough and finally eligible to go, there were no questions on whether I should attend or not, so I signed up as soon as I could. I've never been to Richmond before, nor have I ever set foot in Virginia, so I didn't really know what to expect from a state I wasn't familiar with. All I knew was that the drive down was going to be extremely long, and it was, lasting only about 8 hours! Because this camp was a next level camp, we would have Mass every morning and a type of gathering each night where we would do things like sing, watch videos, and smile and laugh at the skits performed by the Catholic Heart Workcamp staff. At first, the thought of doing this everyday seemed like it would be a bit much, but I soon realized that I began to like it a lot.

Before I had even left my home, when I learned that my assignment was to work at the Coal Pit Learning Center, I didn't know what to expect. Was I going to clean and paint, or may be just play with the kids that attend the school? I was soon going to find out I would be doing all 3 and much more. Group 5, as my group was labeled, consisted of an adult leader from Pennsylvania, 3 boys from Maryland, North Carolina, and Virginia, and 3 girls including myself, all from St. John's. All seven of us cleaned, painted, stained wooden tables, put new mulch in their garden, and even played a few games of Speed Ball and Land and Sea with the Coal Pit kids. All children at the Coal Pit Learning Center had varying personalities, especially my team's favorite girl, Gia, who had a habit of getting into trouble. All the students made us laugh and smile the entire time we were with them, and that was a definite highlight of working there.

Helping the people at a daycare for low income families truly showed me that not all hope is lost when money gets tight and times get tough. At first, I was a bit apprehensive about working at a place with a lot of young children, but I soon remembered that "God has a reason for assigning us wherever we go." Teaming up with Group 5 and working at Coal Pit grew on me and by the end of the week, I found myself not wanting to leave. I know, without a doubt, that I will be going to camp next year, and if you are someone who hasn't gone yet, I highly recommend that you go too. My first year at camp is definitely a year I will never forget and I hope I create many more memories at all the camps I will attend in the future. Thank you.

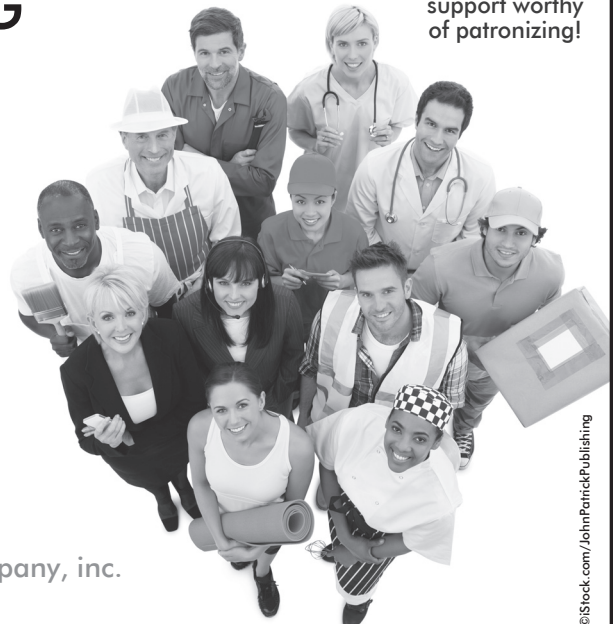
