FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Friends,

Many of us will remember the CBS TV hit "Touched By An Angel" which ran for nine seasons from 1994 to 2003. Roma Downey was Monica, the lead angel who acted as a human being in each episode, revealing her true identity to people and sharing an inspiring message of God's love and forgiveness. Downey has become a producer and her latest production is "Ben Hur" – a remake of the 1959 Academy Award-winning classic – which is due to be released in theaters this weekend. It is the story of Judah Ben-Hur, a wealthy nobleman in Jerusalem in 26 A.D. who is wrongly accused of a crime and, after years of being forced into slavery, seeks revenge by way of an epic chariot race and his life-changing interaction with Jesus Christ.. 

I mention this, not because I am an ardent movie fan like Fr. Bill who has an uncanny gift of using movies in his homilies to distil meaningful insights connecting with our life. Instead, my reason is simply to invite us to take note of things that can inspire us – like this movie that has a Christian theme that will not only entertain us but also strengthen our faith as well as that of our children. My own memory of Ben Hur (some 40 years ago when I saw it in the Seminary) is that of a big action-adventure movie but it touched me with a deeper message about faith, hope, patience, and reconciliation in and through Jesus Christ. Downey's own hope is that *"people come in to be entertained by an epic movie experience but that they will go away feeling that, in the same way Ben Hur's heart is opened to the love of God, there might be people watching who are holding onto anger or disappointment and maybe, just maybe, they'll see this film and want to lay down the stone they've been carrying."*


Are we not all looking for these very things? A stronger faith, constant hope, persistent patience and the peace through healing, joy and fellowship that come from reconciliation and forgiveness? We can have these if only we look for them in the right places. We can be proud that our parish is such a place of God's presence, grace and peace. Now that many of our parishioners are returning after vacation, I am thrilled to hear comments like: "What a feeling of home coming!" "We attended Mass in different churches, but nothing like ours!" "I couldn't find this sense of joy and fellowship in any other church during our summer travels. We're so glad to be back home!" etc.

PREPARE FOR MOTHER TERESA'S CANONIZATION

Pope Francis will declare Mother Teresa a saint on September 4, 2016 during the 10am Mass (4am EST) at St. Peter's Square, Rome. Good for us to read her biography and other books on her. The event will be telecast live and so we all can watch it and be inspired by this "saint of the gutters." For millions of people from all walks of life, Mother Teresa's canonization is providentially taking place during Pope Francis's Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy. Even in her lifetime, Mother Teresa was an icon of God's tender mercy, radiating the light of God's love to so many through the works of mercy, both material and spiritual. HOMILY OF POPE FRANCIS ON 31 JULY AT MASS FOR WORLD YOUTH DAY

(Here's the final part of his homily in this bulletin):

After his small stature and the paralysis of shame, there was a *third* obstacle that Zacchaeus had to face. It was no longer an interior one, but was all around him. It was the *grumbling of the crowd*, who first blocked him and then criticized him: How could Jesus have entered his house, the house of a sinner! How truly hard it is to welcome Jesus, how hard it is to accept a "God who is rich in mercy" (*Eph 2:4*)! People will try to block you, to make you think that God is distant, rigid and insensitive, good to the good and bad to the bad. Instead, our heavenly Father "makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good" (*Mt 5:45*). He demands of us real courage: the courage to be *more powerful than evil* by loving everyone, even our enemies. People may laugh at you because you believe in the gentle and unassuming power of mercy. But do not be afraid. Think of the motto of these days: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy" (*Mt 5:7*). People may judge you to be dreamers, because you believe in a new humanity, one that rejects hatred between peoples, one that refuses to see borders as barriers and can cherish its own traditions without being self-centered or small-minded. Don't be discouraged: with a smile and open arms, you proclaim hope and you are a blessing for our one human family, which here you represent so beautifully!

Finally let us listen to the words that Jesus spoke to Zacchaeus, which to be seem meant for us today: "Come down, for I must stay at your house today" (v. 5). Jesus extends the same invitation to you: "I must stay at your house today". We can say that World Youth Day *begins today and continues tomorrow, in your homes*, since that is where Jesus wants to meet you from now on. The Lord doesn't want to remain in this beautiful city, or in cherished memories alone. He wants to enter your homes, to dwell in your daily lives: in your studies, your first years of work, your friendships and affections, your hopes and dreams. How greatly he desires that you bring all this to him in prayer! How much he hopes that, in all the "contacts" and "chats" of each day, pride of place be given to the golden thread of prayer! How much he wants his word to be able to speak to you day after day, so that you can make his Gospel your own, so that it can serve as a compass for you on the highways of life!

In asking to come to your house, Jesus *calls you*, as he did Zacchaeus, by *name*. Your name is precious to him. The name "Zacchaeus" would have made people back the think of the *remembrance of God*. Trust the memory of God: his memory is not a "hard disk" that "saves" and "archives" all our data, but a heart filled with tender compassion, one that finds joy in "erasing" in us every trace of evil. May we too now try to imitate the faithful memory of God and treasure the good things we have received in these days. In silence, let us remember this encounter, let us preserve the memory of the presence of God and his word, and let us listen once more to the voice of Jesus as he calls us by name. So let us now pray silently, remembering and thanking the Lord wanted us to be here and has come here to meet us.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Narrow Door to Successful Living

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate" Luke 13:22-30

Thousands upon thousands of young boys grow up bouncing basketballs and dreaming of a life in the National Basketball Association - the professional ranks. But only a handful are chosen each year. Woe to the young man or young woman who is talented at sports but neglects his or her education! Thousands upon thousands of new businesses are started each year, but only a small number of people in our society become super-successful in material terms. The higher you go up the scale, the smaller the numbers become. Thousands upon thousands of young couples each year stand at the altars of churches like this one and pledge their love to one another, but half these marriages will end in divorce. Many couples will stay together only for convenience, for appearances or for the children. Only an estimated 10% will find true fulfillment in their marriages. The door to any kind of successful living is a narrow one. That is why Jesus reminds us in today's Gospel: "Strive to enter by the narrow door, for many I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able." Successful living requires making hard choices. It requires dedication and sacrifice. How can Christian Faith demand any less?
