SUNDAY REFLECTION: The Aunt at the gates

The parable of Lazarus and the rich man.

Luke 16: 19-31

She was quiet and painfully shy, overwhelmed by the more outgoing personalities of the family she married into years before. She was devoted to her husband; at family gatherings, she stuck to her husband's side, stroking the family dog, as the nieces and nephews buzzed around them. Her conversations were little more than, "Hi, good to see you. How are you?" She always baked for family gatherings - but except for the tarts and cookies, she barely registered.

She and her husband lived only a few neighborhoods away. When they sent birthday and holiday presents, they received thank-you notes when the recipients could easily have walked over. One Christmas she knitted sweaters that quickly found their way to the bottom of closets. She and her husband gave generously. The family responded minimally. Not that they were mean or inconsiderate. Just busy with their lives.

Her husband died first. She continued to live in the house nearby, but without his connection, she saw the family less and less. One niece had grown fond of her; the rest drifted away as they grew up, went to school, got married and had children of their own.

When she died, rather suddenly, the niece took it upon herself to pack up the house. At a Sunday family dinner, she came with mementos: photos, paintings, small pieces of furniture. She also brought a large stuffed envelope. She poured its contents on a table: their thank-you notes. She had saved them. We often realize too late what we mean to one another.

Jesus' story about Lazarus and the rich man seems to belong to a time long ago and a place far away - but the fact is that there are many Lazaruses at our own gates whom we overlook, ignore, dismiss. Lazarus may be sitting at the desk right next to us; Lazarus may even be sitting at our dinner table every night. Today's Gospel challenges us to remove the blinders of self-centeredness from our eyes and hearts to see God in our midst in the poor, the forgotten, the isolated, the marginalized; to realize the dignity of every human being as created in the image of God; to possess the humility that enables us to embrace one another as brothers and sisters, sons and daughters of God.

CHASM BETWEEN HALVES AND HAVENOTS!

"America's Mansions" was a television show featuring homes of the extremely rich in the U. S. It featured the Vanderbilt estate in Hyde Park, New York constructed by a wealthy industrialist of the nineteenth century. It is a fifty-four room home, with a breathtaking view of the Hudson River and the Catskill Mountains in the distance. Another feature concerned the home of Bill Gates the richest man in the world. Its building cost was over \$53 million. It is a fifty-four room house: a 66,000 square foot complex with seven bedrooms, 24 bathrooms, six fireplaces and an 11,500 square-foot inner sanctum for privacy. The financier Nelson Peltz's mansion on his waterfront estate in Florida is worth \$75 million. The original price of the Bel-Air Mansion owned by Iris Cantor, the widow of Gerald Cantor was \$60 million. (<http://www.forbes.com>). We find it hard to imagine living in such luxury. But, neither can we imagine the poverty found around the world. Here is one report of the *United Nations Human Development Commission*. "The richest fifth [20 percent] of the world's people consumes 86 percent of all goods and services, while the poorest fifth [20 percent] consumes just 1.3 percent." The three richest people in the world have assets that exceed the combined gross domestic product of the 48 least developed countries. "Americans spend \$8 billion a year on cosmetics--\$2 billion more than the estimated annual total needed to provide basic education for everyone in the world." Each day over 700 million people do not get enough to eat. Each year twelve million children below the age of five starve to death in a world that produces enough food for everyone to eat over 4 pounds of food a day. 250,000 go blind each year because of a vitamin deficiency in their diet. In Latin America, forty million abandoned children live on the streets. Even in the United States about three million people are homeless at least a part of each year. **In today's gospel, Jesus suggests a remedy: share your blessings generously with others, instead of using them selfishly and thus making yourselves eligible for eternal punishment.**
