	С	 Due to the rising costs of water over the years, the city is investigating the feasibility of increase the reimbursement of water costs for ice rinks, which is currently set at \$200. The final decision on what the new maximum reimbursement will be is yet to be made. Bike Path through Thistledown Park and Wilfrid Jury Bernice Yanful (Public Health Nurse) and the school travel planning committee at Wilfrid Jury identified a need for a bike path through Thistledown Park connecting to Wilfrid Jury PS. 		the road. Many activities are planned for the day including, a

		• Bike Parade: We want to encourage as many people as possible

	 Concern: cars are not able to turn left onto
	Sarnia from Coombs due to traffic (especially
	during rush hours and right after school
	dismissal), drivers are turning right onto Sarnia.
	Drivers then stop on Sarnia and turn right onto
	Brescia Lane causing congestion, poor visibility
	and hazards for pedestrians and cyclists. Drivers
	also fail to watch for pedestrians and cyclists
	when they exit this intersection. Residents also
	believe that the crosswalk is ineffective at this
	location.
