There was music in my mother's house There was music all around There was music in my mother's house And my heart still feels full with the sound.

As I sit here typing this with tears in my eyes, less than a week since my mother was buried, I can not compose the "rah-rah let's get back to school and get ready to rehearse for all of the great performances we are going to do this year" kind of welcome letter for the handbook no matter how many attempts I have made. You may check the calendar for all of those events and you can be certain that we do have a wonderful year of activities planned, but what I really want to say to all of you is "thank you." Thank you for the beautiful basket of flowers at the funeral home that was sent from the "USC Choir Family." Thank you to those of you who braved two tunnels and the Parkway East to find Wilmerding to attend the visitation or the funeral. Some of you, including students, have lost mothers, and my heart silently went out to you as you were consoling me. Thank you for the cards, messages, calls, thoughts, prayers and support you have shown during the past week and throughout my mother's illness. Thank you to 2015 alum, Megan Jones, 2014 alum, Hannah Lane, and seniors Ben Nadler and B. Turner Queen for honoring my mother with the perfect gift prior to the funeral service. Singing Billy Joel's Goodnight My Angel in front of grieving family and friends had to have been incredibly difficult to do, yet they sang beautifully with maturity, dignity and professionalism beyond their years. There was not a dry eye in the funeral home. The outpouring of love from USC has been overwhelming. You are not just my "choir family;" you are a part of my family.

I was blessed to have had two loving parents who saw the value in giving their children a music education. There was always music in my mother's house. Both of my parents had beautiful voices and sang or played music constantly around the house. My brother played the accordion (as every good Serbian/ Croatian boy did) and piano, and majored in Music Education with a concentration in voice and piano. I played the piano, flute, my grandfather's violin, and quitar, and majored in Music Education with a concentration in voice and piano. We all sang in the church choir, and my father played and sang lead in a Tamburitza Orchestra. In fact, he had a great time performing with his group on New Year's Eve in 1990, but was diagnosed with leukemia New Year's Day, and died five months later. After his first round of chemotherapy, which, I remember being told was strong enough to kill a horse, he sat up in his hospital bed and sang Easter hymns. My mother was in the audience of every performance she could attend. When she wasn't well enough to attend, she would stay awake until I got home so I could show her a program and tell her about the performance.

My parents left a legacy of love for their family and friends, a legacy in which singing and music played major roles. I am very fortunate to share that love with the parents and students at USC, and to be a part of your family. Thank you for all you do to encourage and support the arts, and for supporting me through this difficult time.

Choral Booster Incentive Program

General Fund Account

The General Fund is created through the fundraising efforts of the Choral Booster Organization. At the close of each budget year, the Executive Board will allocate a specific amount of funds from its operating budget, after all expenses have been paid, to the General Fund.

- Some of the General Fund Account will be distributed to Student Incentive Accounts every 4th year for the major Music Department Trip (historically the Disney Trip). Only those students who are paid Choral Booster members will be eligible to receive these funds.
- General Account Funds will be distributed to all eligible students equally.

 - ► Musical Basket Auction
 - ► Chic-Fil-A/Chipotle Nights

Student Incentive Accounts

A student incentive account is comprised of the monies raised by each student through fundraising events offered throughout the year. These funds are available to use for any choral trip taken during a student's four years at USC High School.

When a student registers for chorus, and joins the Choral Boosters, a student incentive account is opened for them through the Choral Boosters Organization. This account will remain open as long as the student is a member of Chorus and until the student graduates.

Upon graduation the student's incentive account funds will be transferred to a sibling's account in the USC HS Choral Program. If there is no sibling in the Choral Program, the funds will be transferred into the Choral Boosters General Fund Account. Choral Booster Incentive Account Funds can only be transferred to other siblings within the High School Choral Department. Funds cannot be transferred to siblings in other music departments.

undraising Opportunities

The Choral Boosters provide various opportunities throughout the school year for students to raise funds for their individual Student Incentive Account, and for parents to help strengthen the Choral Booster General Account. With the exception of the Joe Corbi Fundraiser (which is sponsored by the Band Association) all profits from Choral Booster Fundraising funnel into either the individual student's incentive account and/or the Choral Booster general fund. The Student Incentive Account is funded to pay for both choral department and music department trips. All choral students have the opportunity to participate in planned trips.

It is important to note that your singer will not be eliqible to apply incentive account balances to trip expenses unless his/her family is a member of Choral Boosters.







Men's Ensemble — An elective course open to male students in Grades 9-12 interested in participating in a choral group. The Men's Ensemble, one of four performing groups at the high school, is designed to accommodate new students entering the Choral Department, as well as

upperclassmen who enjoy the camaraderie of singing in an all-male choir. Members study basic singing techniques and the basic elements of music. The repertoire ranges from music of the Renaissance, Barbershop and popular styles of music. All coursework is completed in class during rehearsal, except for occasional evening rehearsals (if necessary), and a minimum of three mandatory annual concerts. Students receive regular grades as in academic subjects. Students in this ensemble are required to pay a Wardrobe Fee of \$30.00. The Men's Ensemble always provides an entertaining addition to USC's Choral Concerts, and often performs in the community on field trips. *No audition is necessary.*

Women's Choir — An elective course open to female students in Grade 9 who are interested in participating in a choral group. Members study basic singing techniques and the basic elements of music. The repertoire is of a varied nature including classical, secular, musical theatre, and popular songs. All coursework is completed during rehearsals in class, except for occasional evening rehearsals (if necessary), and a minimum of three mandatory annual concerts. Students receive grades as in academic subjects. Performance field trips may be taken. Students in this ensemble are required to purchase a shirt at the cost of approximately \$15.00 that will serve as concert attire. **No audition is necessary.**


Clarion Choir — Open to all female students in grades 10 -12 who are interested in participating in a performing choral group. Members study singing techniques and intermediate elements of music. The repertoire is of a varied nature including classical, secular, musical theatre, and popular songs. All coursework is completed during rehearsal in class, except for occasional evening rehearsals (if necessary), and a minimum of three mandatory annual concerts. The Clarion Choir performs challenging women's choral music. Performance field trips may be taken. Students receive regular grades as in academic subjects. Students in this ensemble are required to purchase a shirt at the cost of approximately \$15.00 that will serve as concert attire. *No audition is necessary.*

Pantheon Choir— a mixed choir of female students, grades 11-12 and male students, grades 10-12. Students must audition for this ensemble. Auditions will be held the week before course selection sheets are due. As part of the course, members study vocal techniques and advanced elements of music at a higher level than the other performing groups. The Pantheon Choir has had opportunities to perform with the Pittsburgh Symphony, River City Brass, Pittsburgh Civic Orchestra, and other professional musicians, and has collaborated with high school and local choirs in outstanding concerts within and outside of the school district. All coursework is completed during class except for occasional evening rehearsals (if necessary), and a minimum of three mandatory annual concerts. Students receive regular grades as in academic subjects. Students in this ensemble are required to pay a Wardrobe Fee of \$30.00. Prerequisite: Director's recommendation through an audition; participation in a choral group the preceding year. At the discretion of the choral director and administration, this course may be offered as an independent study in a flexible mod/day or after-school scheduling assignment.

The Chanteclairs are selected from the Pantheon Choir.

Chanteclairs — An extra-curricular choir that specializes in *a cappella* music. Only students enrolled in Pantheon Choir may audition for this ensemble. Students in other choirs may also be invited by the director to audition, but must perform with the Pantheon Choir, as well. Chanteclairs rehearse Tuesdays from 2:30-4:15 p.m. Additional rehearsals after school or evenings may be added at the director's discretion.

Theatre Arts—Open to students grades 9-12. The course is designed to meet the performance needs of the class within the boundaries of the curriculum. Students study various aspects of the performing arts, including acting, singing, movement, stagecraft and theater history. Students will work on monologues, scenes, voice and speech activities, improvisation, movement, character development and audition preparation. The course may be taken consecutive years.

PMEA: The Pennsylvania Music Education Association exists to help Pennsylvania music educators. They offer opportunities for students to perform in festivals, both honorary and adjudicated, for which a school can earn credit toward certification. They encourage excellence in the profession, across the state. The PMEA is affiliated with MENC, the National Association for Music Education.

NAfME: The National Association for Music Education is the world's largest arts education organization & the only association that addresses all aspects of music education. 130,000+ members represent all levels of teaching (preschool–graduate school). Since 1907, NAfME has worked to ensure that every student has access to a well-balanced, comprehensive, & high-quality program of music instruction taught by qualified teachers.

ACDA: The American Choral Directors Association is a non-profit music education organization whose central purpose is to promote excellence in choral music through performance, composition, publication, research, and teaching. This organization sponsors Mucho Macho Music and Sweet Harmony Festival, grades 6-9.

National Standards for Music Education:

- 1. Singing, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music
- 2. Performing on instruments, alone and with others, a varied repertoire of music
- 3. Improvising melodies, variations, and accompaniments
- 4. Composing and arranging music within specified guidelines
- 5. Reading and notating music
- 6. Listening to, analyzing, and describing music
- 7. Evaluating music and music performances
- 8. Understanding relationships between music, the other arts, and disciplines

Honors Choir: Pennsylvania schools are clustered into Districts. USC High School is in District 1. Choral students audition to perform at their District's Annual PMEA Honors Choir Festival. This year, District 1's PMEA Honors Choir Festival on October 30-31 will be held at Seton Hill University. There are no auditions for this event this year. Paper applications will be handed out during the first week of school. Participation by all USCHS choral students is highly encouraged.

Seats/Chairs: A concertmaster in an orchestra is called "the first chair." At an auditioned festival, students are ranked by seating or by "chairs." The "first chair" would have the highest total points, "second chair" the second highest points.

You May Want to Know

Adjudication: A formal music performance assessment. For choral music, typical adjudication categories are quality of sound (tone, intonation, vowel uniformity, blend/balance), technique (rhythm/precision, diction/articulation), and musicality (interpretation/style, phrasing, expression, sensitivity, dynamics).

Madrigal Dinner: Chanteclairs present the evening's musical entertainment for Choral Booster's historic annual dinner and fundraiser. Pageantry, costumes, feasting! Don't miss this most delightful celebration held in November.

Backstage Greetings: This Choral Booster fundraiser provides families the opportunity to send a backstage greeting card & congratulatory star cookie to any student involved in the spring musical. This program is a long-standing tradition at USC.

Theater Angels: The Music Department asks that the parents of all students participating in the spring musical (cast, orchestra, costumes, makeup, ushers, stage crew, etc.) volunteer as Theater Angels during the musical season. This year's Theater Angel meeting will be held in January 2016. Theater Angels have an opportunity to pre-order musical tickets! It's a win-win opportunity. Consider being a Theater Angel.

Drama Director: The director for the Fall Play & Spring Musical is Mr. J.R. Hall.

Music Theory and Music Theory Advanced Placement (AP): A full year course providing students with a learning experience equivalent to that of an introductory college course in music theory. The course develops a student's ability to recognize, understand, describe, and analyze the basic materials and processes of music that are heard or presented in a score. The course emphasizes integrated approaches to the student's development of aural, sight-singing, written, compositional, and analytical skills through listening, performance, written, creative, and analytical exercises.
