Also scheduled are focus group sessions on education, organization activities, and membership presented by and for LSPA members.



ROBERT H. SHEMWELL SPEAKS TO LPA

Robert H. Shemwell, Magistrate Judge and Clerk for the US District Court, Western District of Louisiana, was a speaker at a Lafayette Paralegal Association meeting. Mr. Shemwell reviewed a "Guide to Federal Practice" prepared by his office, and presented a videotape and explanation of the "electronic courtroom" to be installed at the new federal courthouse in Lafayette and presently in use at the courthouse in Shreveport.

DOMESTIC ABUSE INTERVENTION PROGRAM PRESENTED TO LPA

Diane Conery with the Lafayette City Prosecutor's office, and Tom L. Stagg, Executive Director of the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project, a non-profit agency coordinating Lafayette Parish's response to domestic violence, spoke to LPA about changes in the law and changes in law enforcement's response to victims and batterers.

Conery and Stagg were instrumental in reforming the local judicial system's handling of domestic abuse cases. Efforts have been coordinated to provide protection for victims and intervention for the batterers.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTIES

Jesse Lambert, local attorney with the Onebane Firm, spoke to LPA on intellectual properties law. In today's technological society, this specialized field of law is rapidly advancing as it deals with issues of ownership, including internet sites and information, patents, trademarks, copyrights, and trade secrets.

Mr. Lambert's presentation included how intellectual property rights are secured, maintained, and exploited and how to obtain relative information and publications.

LABOR LAW FROM A PLAINTIFF'S POINT OF VIEW

Assistant City-Parish Attorney and immediate past president of the Lafayette Parish Bar Association, Michael D. Hebert, spoke to Lafayette Paralegal Association members and guests on labor law from a plaintiff's point of view. His presentation included employment law in the Louisiana Civil Code, exceptions to employment at will, sexual harassment, and procedural issues in employment litigation.

DAVID COOK, MEDIATOR

Mediation and arbitration were the themes of David Cook's presentation to the Lafayette Paralegal Association. After years of practice, Mr. Cook became one of the first attorneys in this area to engage in mediation on a full time basis. His presentation included the benefits of mediation, the mediation procedure, the role of the mediator, types of settlements, satisfaction of the parties, benefits to attorneys, and suggestions for plaintiff and defense counsel mediation preparation.

Member of the International Society of Crime Prevention Practitioners, assistant developer of the Crime Wise and Street Wise Seminar Programs, and graduate of the Texas Crime Prevention Institute, Ann Walsh, gave LPA members common sense precautions for personal safety and crime prevention.

With information from the FBI, Justice Department, Attorney General reports, local police departments, and other recognized authorities, Ms. Walsh discussed how criminals target victims at home, in the car, and on the street, how to make yourself less vulnerable, and when to fight and when to escape. Ann Walsh's humorous presentation made a serious and sometimes squeamish topic entertaining.

MEDICINE IN THE LAW OFFICE

Charlene Reynolds, R.N., and paralegal with the Onebane Firm, spoke to the Lafayette Paralegal Association about obtaining and interpreting medical records. Ms. Reynolds' thirteen years' practice as a registered nurse made her an expert in interpreting medical records. She gave LPA members an invaluable resource — a list of medical abbreviations.


