There are some things I'm pretty good at doing and some things I fail at accomplishing.

One of the things I fail to do well is wait. Husband Zack comments on that occasionally. 'Maggie, you're not a good waiter.' I confess, he's right! I want computers to come on immediately, I want food to cook faster, and I want this presidential election to be over!

Meanwhile, I realize I am not following God's lead on waiting, for I believe that part of resting in the arms of God is allowing everything to happen in God's time. Just when it seems it's been too long, usually that which is waited for happens – ever noticed that?

That way, when the new pastor comes, everything is not down pat, but rustled and shoveled enough to give the 'new pastor's way' space for rooting.

All this is happening in the waiting time.

I wanted to thank you for being open to some new ideas and approaches while you wait. You've been remarkably flexible! I think that's good news for the pastor the Holy Spirit is sending you. And when that day comes, suddenly, the waiting will be over! And your new pastor will be mightily blessed because you have waited so well and will be ready for the next chapter. May God bless you for keeping your beloved home church so healthy and ready to warmly welcome the shepherd who is surely on the way!

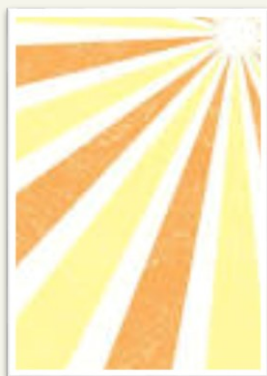

Message from the Stewardship Committee

One Hundred-Plus Supporting God

We need one hundred plus families (or individuals) to support God's work at Rumble. In 2013 107 of our over 250 families were making a financial commitment to support God's work at Rumble. Now there are only 74 families making a financial commitment. This may seem like a small number to support our programs, but remember about one-fourth of our members are affiliates, many of whom do not make a written financial commitment at Rumble.

Those 74 families and individuals who have continued to generously support the work of God in this Church have been faithful stewards during a trying period. We have disagreements about same-sex marriage and had two unexpected changes in our pastor. Don't think by this that we are in trouble. We are not! We have adequate reserves to fall back upon. However, think of what could be done if more of our members were making a financial commitment and supporting God's work with their time and talents.

Why should my family make a financial commitment to God's work at Rumble? This is a question each of us must answer based on our own belief. The Biblical answer is God has told us to support His work through the use of our time, talents, and treasure. You may be interested in a particular program of the church, such as; music, mission, compassion, etc. You may wish to only give to one program of the church and not make an overall financial commitment, but when you do this remember that all of our programs use the general resources of the church. Restricting the use of your financial contribution may result in a reduction of other programs which are important.

What are these general resources? They include the professional and non-professional staff, our buildings, our equipment, etc. Our budget is made up of: personnel costs about 60%, property costs about 20%, mission costs about 10% and programs about 10%.

What would happen if over 100 families made a financial commitment to God's work at Rumble? The first thing would be the finance committee would need to ask our program committees how to use these extra funds. Each of these committees has dedicated members who need to allocate resources, which it is our job to provide. Will you be one of the 100+ families making a financial commitment to do God's work at Rumble this year?
