



Most recently, Jane served as a guest artist, instructing students as a part of Rochelle Middle School’s A+ program. The artist residency program is made possible by a grant from the North Carolina Council to the Community Council for the Arts in order to help the school shape its curriculum around the arts as a way to engage students. Jane worked with students in art teacher Sarah Sloop’s classes to create *talking sticks*, crepe myrtle branches wrapped and decorated. The project, reflective of American Indian culture and traditions, was introduced as a method by which students could share their story, as a self-portraiture. Students personalized their art using leather, fabric, beads, feathers and other materials. Students’ individual talking sticks were then organized into a single sculpture depicting their voice.
