5) Great Smoky Mountain National Park

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park was established on June 15, 1934 after overcoming numerous economic, cultural, and political issues. Today the park is the largest protected land area east of the Rocky Mountains. It is also the most visited national park in the American Park System. The main entrances are located along the US Highway 441.

The history of the Appalachians is a precious thing and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park preserves this history. These mountains have been around for thousands of years from the prehistoric Paleo Indians to the 18th century European settlements and loggers and Civilian Conservation Corps in the 20th century. The protection of history, wildlife, and nature are very important to the park. There are many great attractions to see while visiting the park. The most popular attraction is <u>Cades Cove</u>. Others include: <u>Roaring Fork</u>, Cataloochee, Elkmont, Mountain Farm museum and Mingus Mill at Oconaluftee. Don't forget to watch out for <u>Clingmans Dome</u>, the highest point in Tennessee and the Smokies.

It's no coincidence they're called "The Great Outdoors" and "The Great Smoky Mountains." They're all great. Here are a few reasons why.

Reel 'em in

You've heard about mountain trout. Now come catch some! There are 2,100 miles of streams in Great Smoky Mountains National Park that offer big fun you won't find in other Tennessee national parks. Meanwhile in Gatlinburg, the Little Pigeon River flows right through town and the city parks. There's nothing more peaceful than tossing your line in the water and angling for the big one. Downtown Gatlinburg has plenty of full service fishing outfitters for all your fishing needs.

Cycling in the Smokies

Cyclists love the Cades Cove loop in Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Touring this historic community on two wheels is one of the best ways to explore the area up close. Bring along a picnic lunch for the trip and enjoy a day in the mountain air as you cruise along the Gatlinburg bike trails.

Birdwatching

Bring your binoculars and your logbook, because you're bound to see something special. Great Smoky Mountains National Park is a premier habitat for a huge number of bird species (not to mention the people who enjoy watching them). The crests of the Smokies tower nearly a mile above the foothills, creating a range in elevations and a variety of topographies that provide a rich diversity of habitats and microclimates for birds.

From the high, exposed peaks, to the warmer, sheltered lowlands, some 240 species of birds have been found in the Smokies. Sixty species are year-round residents. Nearly 120 species breed there, including 52 species from the neo-tropics. Many other species use the park as an important stopover and foraging area during their semiannual migrations.

Ziplining: Hold on tight.

Experience your canopy adventure in downtown Gatlinburg. If you've been waiting to try ziplining or are ready to go again, outfitters can hook you up to some wild rides. Fly by the seat of your pants at 50 miles an hour on the edge of Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

Mountain Golf

If you're looking for a challenge, this is it. The game is the same, but Gatlinburg golf courses are just a little bit different—up and down, up and down, with hardly a flat spot to be found. Test your skills against a magnificent background of one of the most scenic Tennessee national parks. There are two local courses, so bring your clubs and make a tee time at Gatlinburg Golf Course or Bent Creek.

Saddle up

Explore the mountains like the original settlers did - on foot and on horseback. Smoky Mountain Stables & Sugarlands Riding Stables offer guided, backcountry excursions for kids and grownups, too.

Lace 'em up

Great Smoky Mountains National Park is a hiker's wonderland. There are over 800 miles of hiking trails, from easy strolls to rugged backcountry mountain treks. A Guided Nature Service is available for a more educational and in-depth look at the Smoky Mountains. For gear and supplies, choose from one of several full service outfitters. Be prepared before entering the backcountry, though. There are bears out there! You'll find plenty of helpful information and maps on Smoky Mountain hiking trails at visitor centers in Gatlinburg and the Park.

Splashdown

Get ready to rock the rapids on a whitewater rafting adventure. There's nothing as exhilarating as a trip down an untamed river, and there are miles of Class III and IV rapids and plenty of outfitters to help you plan a group expedition or join one. The Big Pigeon and other regional rivers offer Gatlinburg rafting challenges to the max.
