

EVEF Club Rules

Effective April 8, 2016

1. AMA membership is required to join EVEF.
2. EVEF members will fly in accordance with the AMA Safety Code (Page 4 of the AMA member manual - <http://www.modelaircraft.org/files/memanual.pdf>)
3. Only electric powered R/C models are permitted to fly in Basins 115 and 116 by EVEF members per requirements of the City of Mesa.
4. EVEF members are **strongly** urged to use 2.4GHz radio control equipment as there is no frequency control for 72MHz and there may be 72MHz is use from other nearby flying sites.
5. EVEF members are required to fly their aircraft from the floor of Basins 115 and 116 per requirements of the City of Mesa. The City of Mesa does not permit any piloting of R/C aircraft from the rim or sidewalk of either basin.
6. EVEF members are expected to maintain a flight line of no less than 10 feet from the “crease” created where the basin’s slope intersects with the basin floor. The general public and EVEF members not actively flying should be requested to remain behind the flight line unless involved in a competition timing activity.
7. When crossing the power lines and Elliot Road to the south of Basins 115 and 116, members are to make every effort to cross this corridor as high as possible and there is to be **no loitering/circling over the road or power lines.**
8. EVEF members flying FPV must follow the AMA Safety Code- Document 550. (<http://www.modelaircraft.org/files/550.pdf>)
9. EVEF members must always give maximum clearance to full-size aircraft operating in the area. Models must always turn and fly at a right angle to the full-size aircraft’s flight path regardless no matter what the relative altitude is of the model aircraft.
10. EVEF members are to be respectful of each other’s flying interests and any other AMA member(s) who might fly at either Basin 115 or 116. Both basins operate on a first-come basis. The City of Mesa requires all pilots be AMA members or have supplemental insurance.
11. The City of Mesa, Mesa Parks and Recreation Police, and Mesa Police have jurisdiction over these facilities. EVEF members should take whatever actions are appropriate to ensure safety and the goodwill necessary to maintain access via our permit to these two great flying sites.
