Day 1 – Departure (Meals: L, D)

Meet at Honolulu International Airport; 9:00AM at LOBBY 8

Asiana Airlines Flight OZ 231 Departs Honolulu at 11:20AM

Check-in at designated counter. You'll only need your passport to check-in. Baggage allowance is two (2) baggages at fifty (50) pounds each. Any over limit baggage are incidental expense and you shall be responsible for the charges. You will receive your boarding pass and baggage claim ticket after checking in.

Day 2 – Welcome to KOREA! (Meals: D)

Arrival to Incheon International Airport at 5:10 PM

After retrieving your baggage(s) and clearing customs you will be welcomed by our local guide / coordinator. You'll be given some time to exchange cash at the airport and escorted to your charter bus. You will be transported to Seoul for dinner.

*Incheon to Seoul approximately 1:20 hour drive

Dinner will be provided prior to hotel check-in. The guide will assist you to check-in at the designated hotel provided with breakfast coupon and room key.

Day 3 – Seoul (Meals: B, L, D)

We begin the day by taking you to a money exchange office, offering you one of the best exchange rates available for USD to Korean Won.

Shinsa-dong / Garosu-gil

Garosul-gil means "tree-lined streets". Seoul has lots of these streets but one in particular in Shinsa-dong is well known for locals with its many fashion, collection stores and artistic cafes. Just walking along this street is very fun and you'll find really cool areas to take pictures, see the locals dressed in current fashion trend.

Digital Media City

Digital Media City is a cutting-edge digital media entertainment cluster that houses ubiquitous networked offices, apartments, museums, exhibitions, conference halls and cultural centers. It was constructed in 2002 is a high-tech city centered on Digital Media Street for broadcasting, movies, games, music, e-learning and related industries.

Hongdae (Hongik University Street)

Hongdae-ap (the area in front of Hongik University) is a neighborhood known for its youthful and romantic ambience, underground cultures, and freedom of self-expression. Unique cafes, cozy galleries, accessory stores, fashion shops, live cafés and clubs, art markets, and gourmet eateries make this a popular hang-out for locals in their 20s and 30s and a fascinating place to walk around. Hongdae-ap is an area that is always packed with people and excitement.

Han River (Han Gang) Cruise

Han River Cruise is one of the best ways to enjoy the scenery in Seoul. Cool wind from the river, the surrounding city lights and on-board live entertainment are the rewards the cruise can offer you.

Day 4 – Seoul / Busan (Meals: B, L, D)

We begin the day checking out of the hotel and departing to Seoul Station for KTX bullet train ride to Busan. The train ride is 2 hours and 45 minutes. The train has limited baggage storage area and you're responsible to carry on your own luggage to board the train. Therefore, we suggest traveling light and if you brought a second luggage, it's ideal to keep it stored at our hotel in Seoul. You're gone for 2 nights only and you'll get your baggage when checking in at the hotel in Seoul.

Seoul Station

Seoul Station is the gateway to Seoul, the capital city of the Republic of Korea. It is a terminus for all of the Gyeongbu line (Seoul-Busan) KTX (Korea Train Express) trains as well as Saemaul, Mugunghwa and Nooriro (eco-friendly electric train) trains. Seoul Station has the highest number of passengers in Korea. The nearby Galleria Department Store and Lotte Mart Discount Store add to the station's attraction.

Jagalchi Fish Market

It's Korea's largest seafood market. Most of the people who sell fish are women, so the women who sell here are called 'Jagalchi Ajumma,' 'ajumma' meaning middle-aged or married women. This market represents Busan and is famous throughout the country. If you visit you can eat fresh raw fish right at the market.

International (Gukje) Market

International (Gukje) Market is one of Korea's largest markets; each alleyway is crowded with stalls, and it connects to a number of smaller markets. The market is a center for both retail and wholesale trade, and a wide variety of goods can be purchased at discounted prices.

Gwangalli Beach

Gwangalli Beach is famous for its fine sand. This area has undergone a water cleaning program, and as a result, the water of the beach is pristine. There are lots of bars and restaurants near the beach along with a fine view of Busan's signature Gwangan Bridge.

Day 5 – Busan / Gyeongju (Meals: B, L, D)

You'll be checking out after breakfast and visiting Busan Tower. Afterwards, it's like traveling back in time, where you'll see the remaining relics of Shilla Kingdom in Gyeongju.

Yongdusan Park - Busan Tower

Busan Tower in Yongdusan Park is a must-see destination for visitors to Busan. Here you can see a 360 degree view of the entire city. The view is very impressive along with snack shops and gift stores along with Busan's most visited public park nearby.

Treasures of Daereungwon Tomb

Large ancient tombs of kings and noblemen of the Silla Kingdom can be seen around Gyeongju at the Daereungwon Tomb Complex (Cheonmachong Tomb). There are twenty-three large tombs located here; the most famous being Cheonmachong and Hwangnamdaechong. In an excavation of the area in the 1970's, Cheonmachong was discovered with a painting of mounted horse. This painting is the only discovered painting from the Silla Era.

Cheomseongdae Observatory

Cheomseongdae is the oldest existing astronomical observatory in Asia. Constructed during the reign of Queen Seon-deok (632-647), it was used for observing the stars in order to forecast the weather. This stone structure is a beautiful combination of straight lines and curves, and was designated as National Treasure No.31 on December 20th, 1962.

Anapji Pond

According to the historical records of 'Samguk-sagi,' Anapji Pond was built during the 14th year of King Munmu (in power 661-681 AD) of the Silla Kingdom (57 BC-935 AD). Small mountains were created inside the palace walls, beautiful flowers were planted, and rare animals were brought in to create an exquisitely exotic garden fit for royalty.

Day 6 – Gyeongju / Yongin / Seoul (Meals: B, L, D)

Bulguksa Temple

Bulguksa Temple is the representative relic of Gyeongju and was designated as a World Cultural Asset by UNESCO in 1995. The beauty of the temple itself and the artistic touch of the stone relics are known throughout the world. Bulguksa Temple was built in 528 during the Silla Kingdom, in the 15th year of King Beop-Heung's reign (514-540).

Seokguram Grotto

Seokguram, located on Tohamsan Mountain, is the representative stone temple of Korea. The official name of Seokguram, National Treasure No. 24, is Seokguram Seokgul. Designated as World Cultural Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1995, it is an artificial stone temple made of granite. The construction was started by Kim Dae-Seong (700-774) in 751 during the reign of King Gyeong-Deok (742-765) of the Silla Kingdom (57 B.C.-A.D. 935) and it was finished twenty-four years later in 774, during the reign of King Hye-Gong (765-780).

Everland Amusement Park

Everland Resort opened in 1976 as the first amusement park in Korea and boasts over 40 heart-pounding rides and attractions. It is also known for its gorgeous flower arrangements and beautiful gardens.

Day 7 – Seoul (Meals: B, L, D)

South Gate Market (Namdaemun Market) OR Myeondong Market

It's the largest traditional market in Korea with various goods in store. All products are sold at affordable prices and the stares in this area also function as a wholesale markets. Most of the goods are made by the storeowners. You may deal for better price with cash and quantity. Myeondong is one of the primary shopping districts in Seoul with many brand name shops, department stores, cosmetics shops, restaurants as well as street stalls.

Insadong Market

Insadong is one of the most memorable attractions in Seoul and represents the focal point of Korean traditional culture and crafts. Stores in Insadong specialize in a wide variety of goods that can only be purchased or appreciated in Korea: hanbok (traditional clothing), hanji (traditional paper), traditional teas, pottery, and folk crafts.

East Gate Market (Dongdaemun Market)

It is a large commercial district comprising traditional markets and shopping centers, specializing in wholesale and retail clothing. A full range of fashion items that cover head to toe, are found here at inexpensive prices.

Live Show - The Painters

The Painters is an innovative non-verbal performance that stages the entire process of painting combined with incredible visual effects and a witty blend of mime, dance and comedy. Audiences will enjoy a play, an art show, and a musical in a single performance that creates about 10 art pieces live on stage through an 80-minute, excitement-filled show.

*Due to season and availability, our tour may offer a different show.

Day 8 – Seoul / Incheon (Meals: B, L, D, B)

It's the last day of the tour. We will start the day a bit later than usual, providing you some free time.

Gwanghwamun Square TOUR PASS:

If you're a first time visitor to Korea OR have not visited the areas listed, these are absolute must see places. Before you depart to Incheon International Airport, we give you the opportunity to go on your own adventure to see the historic and modern Seoul. The Square allows you to see from a central view of the Gwanghwamun Palace, Blue House (President's Residence), King Sejong the Great Statue, plus The National Museum of Korean Contemporary History. You'll be given 3:30 hours to see the areas you prefer but, with good time management you can still see them all.

If you've already seen these places, The Square is within walking distance to many major markets, such as Myeongdong, Insadong and South Gate Market. Please feel free to visit these areas until we meet to depart to airport. You'll be provided with admission tickets where applicable with printed material(s) for your adventure.

Gyeongbokgung Palace

Built in 1395, Gyeongbokgung Palace is also commonly referred to as the "Northern Palace" because it is located furthest north when compared to the neighboring palaces of Changdeokgung (Eastern Palace) and Gyeonghuigung (Western Palace). Gyeongbokgung Palace is arguably the most beautiful and remains the grandest of all five palaces.

National Palace Museum

The National Palace Museum of Korea is a place where visitors can learn about the cultural life and possessions of the royal families from the Joseon Dynasty (1392–1910). It houses over 40,000 artifacts from the palaces of the Joseon Dynasty.

King Sejong Story Museum

King Sejong, the 4th king of the Joseon Dynasty (1397-1450, r. 1418-1450) was responsible for some of the most brilliant achievements in the history of Korea, including the creation of Hangeul (Korean alphabet) and great advancements in the areas of science, culture, art and politics. The passage behind the Statue of King Sejong in Gwanghwamun Square is home to King Sejong Exhibition Hall, which describes some of the king's most astounding contributions to the development of Korea as a nation.

National Museum of Korean Contemporary History

National Museum of Korean Contemporary History is the first national modern contemporary museum ever opened in Korea and it showcases the nation's history in a comprehensive and structured way. The museum first opened its door to the public in December 2012 and presents over 1,500 relics benchmarking Korean history in the arenas of politics, economy, society and culture, beginning from the end of 19th century when the nation opened its ports to the outside world to today.

*Seoul to Incheon approximately 1:30 hour drive
