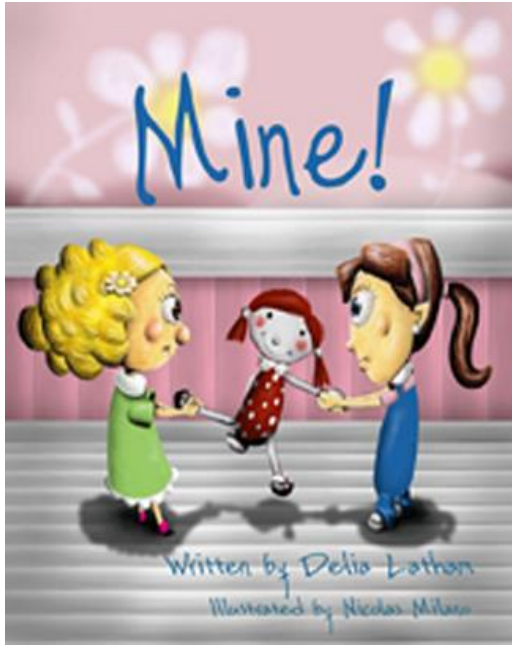


Mine!
