

23rd Eastern Black Bear Workshop

Call for Posters

The 23rd EBBW is soliciting abstracts for posters. The poster session is open to anyone wishing to submit an abstract showcasing recent work in black bear research focusing on Conflict Management, Harvest Management, Population Monitoring, or Field Techniques.

All abstracts must be submitted electronically using the form provided http://personal.psu.edu/erk5072/ebbw/poster_submission_form.pdf. Your abstract should be no longer than 300 words and should highlight your research objectives, methods, and results. Please read through the following guidelines prior to submitting an abstract.

Submission Guidelines:

1. Author Responsibilities:

The author listed first on the abstract will become the primary contact for the abstract following submission unless noted by footnote. The primary contact is responsible for communicating with co-authors regarding acceptance of the abstract and any other relevant information.

2. Abstract Format:

Please follow the example provide on the submission form to include title, authors with contact information, and abstract. Abstract content should be no more than 300 words. Do not include figures or tables.

3. Publication in Workshop Proceedings:

Accepted abstracts with author contact information will be provided to conference participants in the conference proceedings.

4. Poster Presentations:

Posters will be displayed throughout the duration of the conference. Details on poster setup will be provided upon acceptance. A formal 1-hour poster session will occur on Tuesday, April 25 immediately prior to dinner. At least one author is expected to attend the poster session and be available for questions.

5. Important Deadlines:

Abstracts must be submitted by 8:00 a.m. on Monday, March 6, 2017 using the submission form. Authors will be notified of their acceptance via email.
