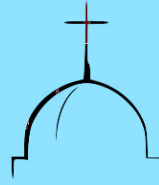

Behold the Lamb!

Reflections by Bob Schrimpf

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away our sins! These familiar words of St. John the Baptist offer us a beautiful meditation. They are spoken every time we attend Mass when the priest holds up the Sacred Host. But is the Host really the body of Christ? The Lamb?

When I was 16 I attended my first retreat. It was run by a Priest in the LA diocese and I was enthralled by his stories and enthusiasm. One story, in particular, I will never forget. It was about a young Roman boy who, upon attending Mass in the catacombs, was tasked with bringing communion to the faithful that were in jail during the Valerian persecution. As he made his way, he was set upon and killed by a mob because he refused to show what he contained so close to his heart. Wrapped in a small cloth, it was the Eucharist and he gave his life protecting Jesus.

I never forgot how the priest impressed upon us how important the Eucharist was to the early church. It his was no symbolic piece of bread. Even more so how a young boy was willing to give his life in defense of this belief. As I grew I occasionally heard mention of this young saint, but only once or twice and nothing that really made the story stick out in my mind as I got older.

Fast forward 30 years. I was able to bring my family to Italy for a never to be forgotten 3-week trip. At one point we wound up exploring the catacombs outside Rome. I became separated from them and was a bit concerned. As I stopped to get my bearings, I suddenly remembered the story of the young boy martyr. I don't know why as I hadn't thought of it in all these years. But there it was in my mind. I had always wondered if it were a true story or if the priest had made it up to help him make his point? I tried to clear my mind and start looking for my family. It was getting late.

As I began to leave, I realized I was next to a large sarcophagus. If you know me, I love history and will read any plaque or monument I come across. So, I began reading the inscription on the tomb. To my great amazement, I found it was the tomb of St Tarcisius, THE young boy who was martyred 1700 years ago while protecting the Eucharist. I could hardly catch my breath and tears welled up in my eyes as my heart raced filled with awe and wonder. It was true! The story of the boy who sacrificed his life for the Eucharist! And only by God's great plan had I arrived at this catacomb and in this particular chamber, pausing just long enough to realize whose tomb it was. I eventually found my children and sat them down to tell them the story of the boy who gave his life for the Eucharist just as I had heard 30 years earlier.

John is going to exclaim boldly in front of the authorities and the crowd gathered that Jesus is the Lamb of God. That took faith on his part to proclaim it with such certainty. On the outside, Jesus looked just like any other man of his time. But John had been told by God that this was the Lamb, and he had seen a dove rest upon him. So, looking through the person of Christ John could see the divinity and he believed. Today, we also must look through bread we receive on Sunday, see the Lamb of God and believe!

Saint Tarcisius

Tarcisius was a martyr of the early Christian church who lived in the 3rd century. The little that is known about him comes from a metrical inscription by Pope Damasus I, who was pope in the second half of the 4th century. The only positive information concerning this Roman martyr is found in a poem composed in his honour by Pope Damasus (366-384), who compares him to the deacon Saint Stephen and says that, as Stephen was stoned by a crowd, so Tarsicius, carrying the Blessed Sacrament, was attacked by a group and beaten to death.
