

Come, Follow Me

Reflections by Bob Schrimpf

Fr Rick Thomas had a ministry to those who lived in the rat-infested, disease-riddled dump of Juarez Mexico. They were among the poorest of the poor. I heard one of his co-workers tell of the first time they decided to have a Christmas dinner to feed the poor. They prepared enough food for 150 people. He said by the end of the day they fed over 300! He was actually the one trimming the meat and handing it out. Not knowing what else to do, he kept cutting and testifies to this day that his side of beef never ran out. It seemed to expand every time he cut a slice off. He witnessed the multiplication of the fish and loaves first hand.

Fr Rick was a dynamic preacher and he wound up one day on our campus at Steubenville as a guest of Fr Mike Scanlon our President. I still remember his fiery talks about action and trust and not putting limits on what God could do. He had all the college students form teams and march up to the projects located nearby the campus. Steubenville at the time had the highest unemployment rate in the country and was recently on the national news attesting to that fact. I was nervous walking into the projects where no student had ever ventured. I was bolstered by the confidence of fr Rick and my fellow classmates and off I went.

We shared our witness to families that allowed us in. We invited the kids to come to campus and form basketball leagues, and we did a lot of praying for families in desperate need. I mostly remember taking action and doing something, anything to help these poor neighbors of ours. I wasn't sitting back or donating to a cause, but actually getting up out of my comfort zone and doing something. A valuable lesson that continues to be the driving force in my life today.

Jesus is in Galilee. Crossroads between trade routes from the Mediterranean and Damascus. The area was multicultural and multilingual allowing his fame to quickly spread. Galilee was also known for its faith healers. They generally set up shop and waited for the sick to come to them. Jesus breaks out of that mold and brings the healing and the Good News to the people. He's proactive in calling disciples, healing others, and preaching the Word. Is there a lesson in all this for us? I think we see that the Kingdom of God is one of action and power. Just like Fr Rick taught me years earlier, we are called out of our complacency and into action. "Come Follow Me", says the Master.
