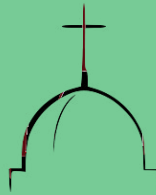




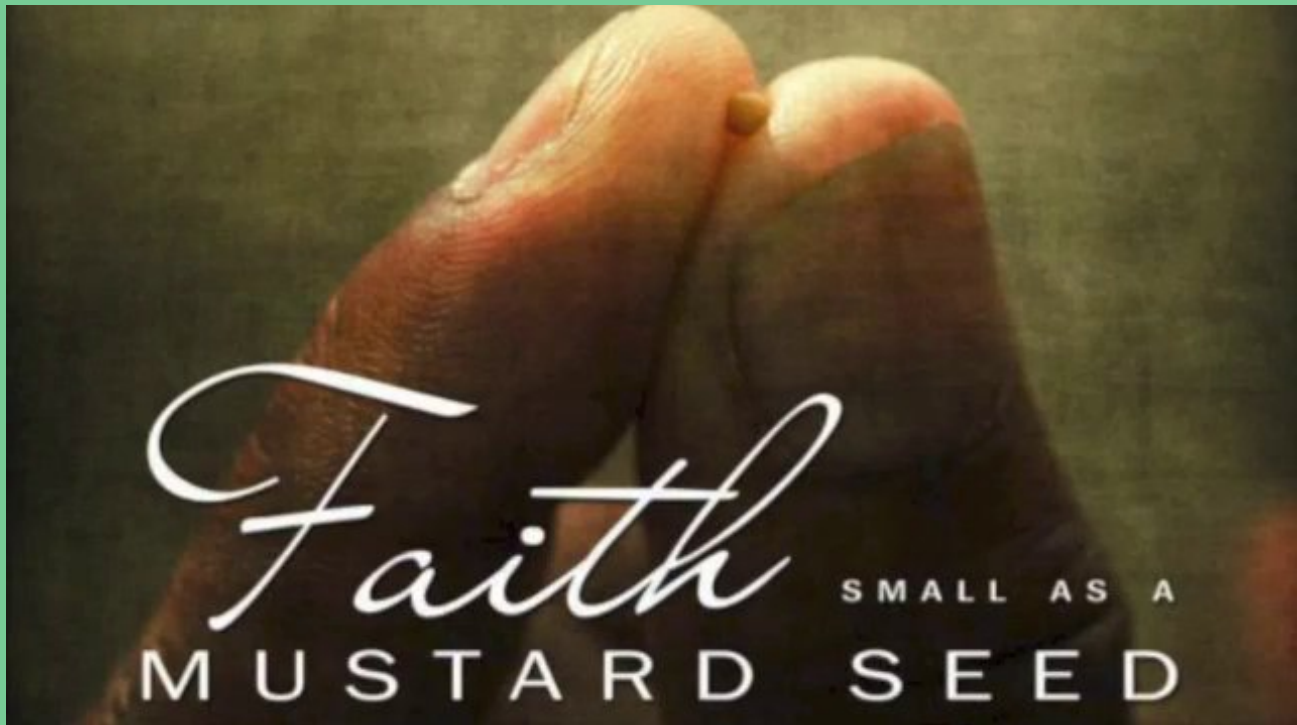

Instant Faith

Reflections by Bob Schrimpf

Just add water... Isn't that how everything is made these days? Instant? We want and we want it now. Microwaves make waiting 30 seconds for what used to take 15 minutes seem like an eternity. We are impatient people. How about commercials? Forget it, we'll just flip to another channel. The 55 MPR speed limit? Well, that's just a suggestion. How about fast food? Usually, it's not nearly fast enough when we're hungry. Stop signs, long lines, and taking our turn all become difficult in the "Me first" and "I want it now" generation.

So when the disciples ask for faith, they want Jesus to just "add water". They don't want to DO anything for this faith they just want it. Maybe Jesus could work a couple of big miracles in front of them right then and there to increase their faith. Or He could fly, or teleport them all to the moon and back. All excellent options that would definitely make them feel something was great about Jesus. It would definitely jump-start their faith, but none of those options would be lasting or real.

There is a popular story about a rundown abbey. It was losing monks who were few in number and depressed at the state of affairs. The beautiful grounds had fallen into disrepair. People had stopped visiting and it was on the verge of closure. The few remaining monks asked the Abbot to speak to a Rabbi who often stayed at a nearby cabin for prayer. Upon speaking to the Rabbi the Abbot returned with a message. He told the monks the Rabbi says that "one of them was the messiah". Upon hearing this news the monks began serving one another with great care and enthusiasm. Their love and generosity spread and attracted other monks. The people began visiting again and the abbey once again thrived.

Jesus says that our faith is learned through action. We must serve and as a humble servant take no credit in the service. It's only our duty. We are doing what is required. God receives the glory lest we become bloated and prideful that somehow we made it happen. Yes, ultimately it will be because of our faith that we will see miracles, but make no mistake about who is working those miracles. If we are humble and serve, God can do mighty things through us, His faithful servants. And then, after a long journey of service, we will look back and see how much our faith has been increased.
