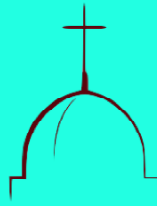

The Publican and the Pharisee

Reflections by Bob Schrimpf

Often we associate the sin of pride with the rich and famous. Pride is defined as "a feeling or deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements". Pride can keep us from asking for help, and in many ways, the poor can just as easily fall into pride as the rich.

Watching my three kids grow up has taught me so many lessons regarding pride. We often joke about a line my middle son used when he was learning to tie his shoelaces. "I can do it myself if somebody helps me!". How many times in life have we felt that same way? Our pride forces us to reject outside assistance. But we all need a little help every now and then.

Years ago while returning from a Youth Group ski trip to Utah we were hit by a major blizzard attempting to get through the mountain passes. Freeway 15 went down to one lane and visibility was down to all but a few hundred yards. Then, the worst-case scenario happened. The bus lost power and wound up ditched on the side of the road. It was nearing midnight and the bus began to rapidly cool with no power.

I remember the bus driver asking me if we should call in an emergency over the radio? Without hesitation, I said 'yes!', and within an hour our call, the national guard was activated. It was a major rescue operation that sent hundreds of people into action. Men and women being woken in the middle of the night to run to our aid! Snowplows, military transports, and an entire town of Beaver mobilizing to receive almost 100 teens stranded in a major blizzard. Within an hour we were rescued and on our way to a warm gymnasium, food, water, and bedding for the night.

It may seem like it was a 'no-brainer' to ask for this kind of help. It was life-threatening. However, how many times do we allow the metaphorical blizzard to hit our lives and never ask for the life-saving help we need? "I can do it myself," we say. "I got myself into this I'll get myself out." is our motto. And with this, pride effectively blocks out grace.

The Pharisee in today's Gospel will stand in the center of the temple for all to see and justify himself. He will state all the good things he has done for the people to see and hear. However, he forgets one very important thing. He never asks for God's help.

In the meantime there is the tax collector beating his breast, unable to lift his eyes, asking God for forgiveness. Jesus tells us that this tax collector went home justified. Why? He simply, and wholeheartedly, asked for help "God, have mercy on me, a sinner". God can not work in the heart that does not ask for His help. And if we ask - he will activate the national guard to rescue us. His angels will surround us, His love will envelop us, and His grace will save us.
