## **The After Life**

Have you ever gone on a trip or paused after a family reunion and felt like you were in heaven? Or maybe just a time and place where you were so content that your heart was full and at peace?

In the summer of my Sophomore year, I attended a Christian Camp in Canada. I never thought I could be so close to so many people so quickly. I felt such joy and peace while water skiing, going down zip lines and playing basketball, as well as going to meetings and discovering God. On the last day of camp, we all exchanged addresses and there were many tears as we said our goodbyes. I didn't want it to end. I was so completely content with these new friends. I felt like this was my first taste of heaven.

More recently my oldest son was married. His beautiful bride's family threw the most amazing celebration. Most of my 10 siblings and their families attended and we celebrated into the wee hours of the morning. The food and drinks were over the top great. No one left early and the dance floor was jammed for every song until 3 am! Another memory of heaven to me as I experienced such joy and love in this celebration of a new union. But eventually, it also had to end.

Today we will find Jesus telling the temple-loving, politically minded Sadducees who don't even believe in a resurrection that they are looking at the afterlife in the wrong way. The Sadducees took care of the Temple and upon His arrival, Jesus was invading their turf and teaching on the resurrection. So the question about who's wife will a woman with 7 husbands be in the afterlife becomes an opportunity to trap Him.

Jesus begins with the fact that there is no marriage in heaven. There are also no brothers or sisters, or mothers and fathers for that matter. There is only God and us - his children. According to Jewish law, the death of a person dissolves a marriage. This woman would not belong to any of the dead men because death had dissolved the marriage. So, technically Jesus could have just tossed out that answer and be done with the meddling Sadducees. However, a greater point to be made and so Christ will continue with their question to emphasize that there is indeed an afterlife. God is the God of the living and we live forever in heaven with Him!

We are bound for heaven and it will be nothing like this earth. The best this earth has to offer is only a foreshadowing of what is to come.
