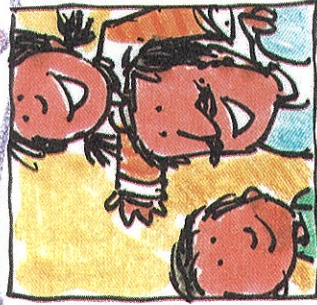
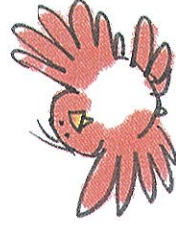

## Family Page

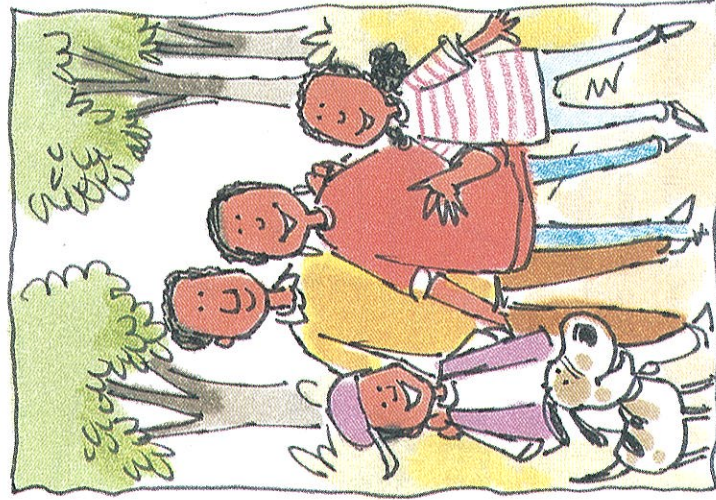
Jesus promised that he would be with us always — and he is. It takes a little practice, but your family can learn to recognize him in the people and things around you. Here are some ideas.

**1** Take a "God walk" together around your neighborhood. Select special places to walk where God's gifts are most apparent: the playground, a nearby park or zoo, your own street, a country lane, or a woodland trail.

**2** As you walk, see how many signs of God's love you can find. Try to remember them for the next part of the project.

**3** Have each member of the family make a small booklet by folding several sheets of paper in half. On the cover of the booklets, write I MET JESUS TODAY. On each of the inside pages, write the name of someone who represents Jesus' love in your life. List on that person's page all the things he or she does that makes you think of Jesus.

Then the stranger began to tell them stories from the Bible. Before they knew it, they were in Emmaus.

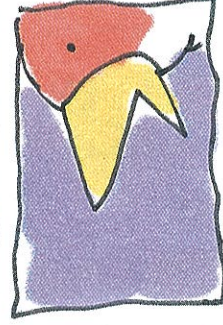
