Restored

The last time we see such a dramatic interaction between Peter and Jesus is during his arrest. Peter proclaims he would never deny Jesus! Yet, a few short hours after that bold proclamation we read of how Peter "wept bitterly" for he had denied Jesus three times. Isn't it wonderful that Jesus cares about us?

Today's Gospel is so involved, but at its essence we see our God coming to restore a broken friendship. How could Peter ever feel composed enough to lead the early Church? Especially when everyone knew he had denied Christ with his words. He ran away. He failed.

Falling from grace, failing a loved one, failing our God, It is all so painful. Without healing we live wounded lives. Christ had every right to walk up to Peter at the Sea of Tiberius and give him a piece of his mind. In front of all the other disciples Christ could have easily reduced Peter to tears. But, how would that have made Peter a better leader? No, Jesus knew that Peter was hurting. The very fact that Peter dove into the water when he spotted Jesus showed how much he loved our Lord. What Jesus did is what Jesus always does. Jesus forgave and then restored.

One day I arrived home late from work. My young son had been particularly difficult that day and mom had sent him to our bedroom to await dad and his punishment. It was late. She was spent, I was spent. As I entered the bedroom my heart was moved with compassion. True I was upset at his actions but my heart melted at the sight of this innocent, frightened child filled with fear and dread at what dad might do. What I did do was sit down, tell him how much I loved him and watched as tears rolled down his cheeks as he experienced forgiveness and restoration. No punishment only reaffirmation that he was my son and I loved him. Forgiven and restored.


