THE POWER OF PERSONAL EVANGELISM

Philip went to look for Nathanael and told him, "We have found the very person Moses and the prophets wrote about! His name is Jesus, the son of Joseph from Nazareth."

"Nazareth!" exclaimed Nathanael. "Can anything good come from Nazareth?"

"Come and see for yourself," Philip replied. (John 1:45-46 NLT)

What does it mean to do personal evangelism in this digital era? Everybody is quite familiar with virtual learning and the new computerized technology. Our world is becoming globally interconnected. One can reach people and places without traveling long distances. There are new generations living in this modern digital age nowadays. Young people and children are now experts using their smartphones and laptops. Many young people are engaged on the internet more than having in-person conversations. Websites and social media can easily give access to places and people living in countries far away. Most of us have direct or indirect access to thousands of real people through our social media accounts and smartphones. You can use a variety of social media for learning new discoveries from notable professors and universities. Anyone can receive their knowledge and scientific research through the internet. Following are just a few views about evangelism ministry from some experts on digital communication:

"Digital tools are a gift for communicating—and so are all other traditional church methods, but they are more effective when used together." Using Social Media for Evangelism (CPO)

"As Christians and Churches, we need to understand how communication is changing, and adapt the way we communicate with those we wish to reach with the gospel. We must avoid reaching the point where what we do inside the church is so distant from what happens outside, that people assume our gospel is as outdated as our technology. If we insist on communicating only in ways that we find familiar, we will find that fewer and fewer people are willing to listen." Pam Smith, Online Mission and Ministry (SPCK). "Digital Evangelism helps us spread the Gospel into all the world at a rate we never could've imagined before." –Centre for Online Evangelism

A recent Barna Group study revealed that 58% of millennials believe digital platforms have made sharing their faith easier. So, if we wish to be relevant to our social context by carrying out the Great Commission, our churches must learn new strategies and methods, and how to use digital platforms that can help us to reach out more crowds. Our evangelistic efforts need to be updated to our time and cultural context. We may ask ourselves, how we can share our faith with others within this digital context? Should we imitate those early Christian disciples instead?

As we read the verses above, we may find such a contrast between those early followers of Jesus Christ and today's digital tools. They shared their story with their friends face to face. Andrew, for instance, found his brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" and he brought his brother to meet Jesus. Philip also did the same. He went to look for his friend Nathanael and shared with him his own testimony. Maybe we just need to say as Philip did, and tell our friends: "Come and see for yourself." Personal evangelism can be so powerful even in this new digital era. Let us go and make disciples in whatever way we are able to do beloved.

IMMIGRANTS/REFUGEES

“And you saw how the LORD your God cared for you all along the way as you traveled through the wilderness, just as a father cares for his child. Now He has brought you to this place.” Deuteronomy 1:31

**“He found him in a desert land, and in the howling waste of a wilderness; He encircled him, He cared for him, He guarded him as the pupil of His eye.”
Deuteronomy 32:10**

“Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David which is called Bethlehem...” Luke 2:4

God’s love for the stranger and the alien is woven throughout the Bible. Abraham left his home to follow God’s leading to an unknown land. Jacob left Canaan with his family to sojourn in Egypt during a time of famine. The children of Israel fled slavery in Egypt and wandered in the wilderness for 40 years. In the New Testament, Mary and Joseph were forced by the Roman government to leave Nazareth and travel to Bethlehem for the census; from there they took their newborn son Jesus and fled to Egypt for their very lives, unable to return to Israel until it was safe. During this month when we celebrate our Savior’s birth, we see that He understands what it’s like to be a refugee, because He was one.

Historically our state has been identified as a place of sanctuary and supply. Beginning with the pioneers we have been a city of refuge welcoming those from many nations. No one has been untouched by this year’s pandemic, but it has hit many immigrant families especially hard. Multiple generations living under one roof make it more difficult to isolate ill family members; language barriers make it difficult to understand instructions on how to keep their families healthy, and the closure of many businesses impacts them as well. May the church in our Metro area “encircle them, care for them...just as a father cares for his child”. May we be His heart in the Heartland for the dispossessed!

Pray—Pray for grace to adjust to a new culture, language, climate and way of life for refugees and immigrants. Upon their arrival refugees have a 90 day window to find a job, begin language studies, navigate life (money, transportation, jobs, work permits, government agencies, etc.).

Pray—Pray for schools, agencies and ministries that work with immigrants and refugees. Ask the Lord to pour His grace and provision on them so that they may be effective advocates for their clients needs. May they have divine creativity in providing their services within the framework of current pandemic restrictions.

Pray—Pray that the Church would embrace and welcome the immigrant and refugee, recognizing the richness of what their cultures add to our city. May we be salt and light and filled with the love of Christ for our newcomers!

Living Faith United Methodist Church follows the policy of Millard Schools. If the schools are cancelled, the church's daytime and evening activities will be cancelled.




Coming up!





Supplies to have at home:

- Necessary medication – ask healthcare provider about obtaining extra
 - If extra is not possible – consider using mail order
- Be sure to have over the counter medicines and medical supplies to treat fever and other symptoms
- Have enough household items and groceries on hand
 - Grocery stores with 'at-risk' hours
 - Consider ways of getting food brought to your house



Everyday Precautions

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
 - If soap and water is not available – use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
- Avoid touching high touch surfaces in public places (elevator buttons, door handles, handrails, handshaking, etc)
- Avoid touching your face, nose, eyes, etc.
- Clean and disinfect your home to remove germs
- Stay home as much as possible



Symptoms and emergency warning signs:

- Pay attention to COVID-19 symptoms (fever, cough, and shortness of breath)
- Emergency warning signs:
 - Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
 - Persistent pain or pressure in chest
 - New confusion or inability to arouse
 - Bluish lips or face



If you get sick

- Stay home and call your doctor
- Consult with your health care provider for more information
- Stay in touch with others by phone or email
- Determine who can care for you if your caregiver gets sick
- Know when to get emergency help
