This past month I finished the 50 personalities of the Pentecostal/Charismatic Movement. Pentecostal Perspective. I was fortunate to have had Dr. Palma as a professor and reading over this material brought back some of the gems I received from him in the classroom. This reading was especially appropriate for the season we are in today, "The Season of Pentecost."

A few weeks ago we celebrated Pentecost Sunday and I imagine, I hope, that many of us preached a message on the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost was an event but it was also the beginning of a process that continues today. Dr. Palma shared "for Pentecostals it is not have we been filled with the Holy Spirit, but rather are we filled today?" Paul stressed in his writings the need for a continued life in the Spirit: Be filled with the Spirit, Walk in the Spirit, Be led by the Spirit, Pray in the Spirit, Sing in the Spirit, Speak the words of the Spirit and celebrate the works of the Spirit. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit was an event in our lives but there is the continual need to be filled with the Spirit!

Pentecost was an event in our lives but it also began a continued process of allowing the Holy Spirit to be the center of our lives and especially our ministries. During this liturgical period of Pentecost, let me encourage you to renew your hearts, minds and ministries in the Holy Spirit. Let us open up our ears to hear what the Holy Spirit is saying to us and our churches today.
