TRANSITIONS

Someone said that change is hard and if you don't believe me then try to bend a quarter. I think all of us know that throughout our ministry we face many challenges and transitions which require us to reexamine the way we view and fulfill our calling to ministry.

One of the most important aspects we deal with during these times is looking at our own identity, who we truly are. I've joked many times how after retirement from the military, my greatest challenge was how to answer the telephone. I was no longer a chaplain, so I couldn't answer chaplain. I wasn't pastoring so I couldn't answer pastor. I was not comfortable answering Doctor, fearing that someone would think I was a medical doctor. So eventually I just picked up the phone and said, "hello." Many individuals tend to place their identity in their positional title but at the end of the day we are simple who we are. Our titles do not define us but rather we are defined by our character, integrity, and the way we treat each other.

I have watched over the years that during pastoral transitions there are many emotional and spiritual issues that both individuals and congregations face. There is the uncertainty of what they will do for leadership and many times they become anxious about the future. Sometimes they even look for another church or leader who has stability rather than walk through the transition with their own congregation. There can also be grief due to the changing in roles of current relationships and at times even anger because of having to face these changes. There can be a variety of emotions and responses during these times which can have either a positive or negative outcome.

The main factor to keep in mind during these times is the "Mission" God has placed upon not only you, but upon the church. We live in a very individualistic society, yet we are so deeply dependent upon each other. We must keep in mind the prayer of Jesus, that we might be one so that in unity we can truly fulfill our mission of evangelism and discipleship. It is very true that we can do so much more together than we can do individually. It really is about fulfilling Christ commission.

I remember a period time when I was faced with a possible life altering transition. I became so anxious that it was beginning to impact my ability to connect with people and to even provide ministry. As I was driving home one evening, I just began
