vidual congregations are encouraged to use up to



News Brief

In the last issue of *The Messenger*, I listed eight overtures that I was watching in the 222nd General Assembly of the PC(USA), held in Portland, Oregon in June.

Following are the outcomes for those eight overtures.

043—On Amending the Book of Order to Clarify Titles to Ordered Ministry

(Approved as Amended) The final text of this amendment brings back the title "Minister of Word and Sacrament," while retaining the term "Teaching Elder" as a de-

scriptor to distinguish from a Ruling Elder. (Personal note: this is a change I greatly support; I consider myself a Minister of the Word and Sacrament, and rarely call myself a Teaching Elder. (December 2019)

050—On the Admission of, and Apology for, Harms Done to the LGBTQ/Q Members of the PC(USA), Family and Friends (Approved with an Alternate Resolution) An alternate resolution that was approved covered the purpose of this overture. The final text affirms that "Followers of Jesus Christ know that no person can claim divine favor through personal merit, but only by the grace of God," and expresses acknowledgement and sorrow over past actions that may "have at times led God's beloved [LGBTQQ children]...to feel that they stand outside the grace of God."

051—On Resources for Learning, Reflection, and Reconciliation (Answered with Action on Another Resolution) This resolution had to do with learning about and reflecting on the ways that American society, culture, and political institutions have marginalized and disempowered Americans from communities of color. The final text in response to this resolution recommends several actions of communication, education, and training to raise awareness and work to combat implicit bias and antiracism.

052—On Amending G-2.0607c to Require Training in Evangelism (Disapproved) The suggested amendment would have added "practical training in evangelism" as a prerequisite for a presbytery to certify a candidate ready for examination for ordination. The 1984 GA considered and rejected this same concept, stating that "it is inappropriate for the [GA] to seek to achieve the great ends of the church through placing a requirement of seminary courses in the Constitution." The final recommendation adds that if the presbytery chooses to, it may require training in evangelism to its candidacy requirements, as PEVA and others require clinical pastoral education.

056—On Amending Book of Order G-6.04 and Standing Rule F.5.b.(1) to Require Two-Thirds Vote on Constitutional Changes (Answered with Action on Another Resolution—FINAL ACTION: Disapproved with Comment) (details on comments are in the pastor's office)

060—On Approving an "Affirmation of Creation" (Approved as Amended) The final text on this overture reads "That God has connected all life on Earth in a network of kinship by virtue of biological evolution from common ancestors" and "That, in response to God's call, we Homo sapiens (modern humans) emerged, in our wide diversity and different cultures, as a species over more than 6 million years of hominin development."

061—On Amending Section G-2.1001 to Clarify the Discretion Given Presbyteries to Utilize Commissioned Ruling Elders (Disapproved) (details are in the pastor's office)

064—On Taking Specific Action to Address the Worsening Plight of the African American Male (Approved as Amended with Comments) Encourages specific action in word and deed and in working with other agencies to address and improve the plight of African American males in Baltimore, Charlotte, Cleveland, New York, and Pittsburgh. (details are in the pastor's office—will be watching for outcomes)
