## Invitation and Outreach: Pentecost Offering, Fifth Sunday Offering, and the Block Party



Thank you, church family, for making the One Great Hour of Sharing offering a success! We collected \$433.00—a good showing, considering we had a 5th Sunday offering the week before. You always step up to the plate when it comes to giving, and it is appreciated!

Up next: the Pentecost Offering. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also addresses the needs of at-risk children. Forty percent of the Pentecost offering is retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. Money gets distributed into three areas: Young Adult Volunteers, Ministries for Youth, and children at risk. Our portion of the money (40%) benefits the Children’s Center. This offering runs from 04/26/15 to 05/24/15.

On May 31st we will be collecting our second 5th Sunday offering of the year. Just like the last 5th Sunday, we will be collecting canned goods for Franklin Cooperative Ministry and any monetary donation will go to the FPC Compassion fund. We will make sure to announce this in the coming Sundays.

Mark your calendars for our annual block party! This year’s block party will be on Saturday, June 27th from 12:00pm-2:00pm. We will have inflatables, delicious food, and **Harry Christie** will be there with snow cones and popcorn. A good time will be had by all—you won’t want to miss it! As with prior block parties, we will need monetary donations and people willing to help with the event. More information will be upcoming, please let me know if you have any questions.

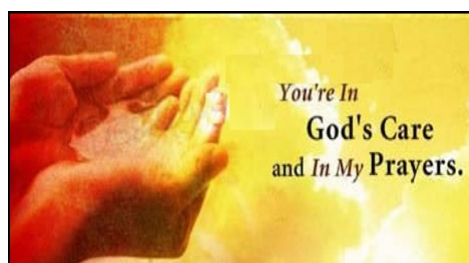

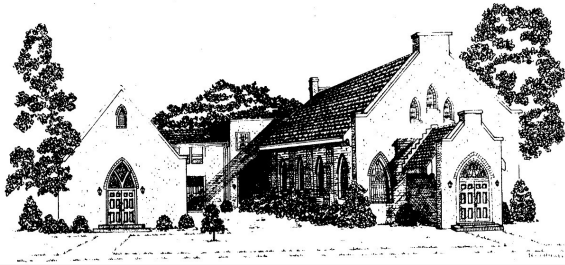

One of the most interesting classes I took in seminary was “World Christian Perspectives.” Despite the title of the course, one of the assignments was to interview Christians *and non-Christians* using specific questions about religion, faith, and spirituality. I discovered with amazement that I was having to scramble to find the required number of non-Christians in order to complete the assignment. That was my first clue that I unconsciously tended to socialize and be with people who are just like me. Now that I am in active ministry, of course, it is even MORE difficult to be around people who don’t look or think like I do.

What about you? My guess is you may find, as I did, that most of your family and friends and co-workers are (eerily?) similar to you.

This leads us to ask ourselves some really crucial questions: Where can we go to be with others who are not like us? How often can we get there? And, once there, can we take the opportunities God puts in front of us to share the good news? Sometimes, our web presence can help us reach those “others.”

On our Facebook page last week, I shared a graphic that said, “We will never change the world by going to church. We will only change the world by being the church.” What we do inside the church to nurture and renew each other is to give us strength and courage to go outside the church and be the church—be the voice and hands of Christ in our world, and that means with folks who are likely going to be very different from us. It’s our God-given mission; we don’t have to be perfect at it, but we are called to obey. How can we, individually and together as a congregation, answer those questions? I would love to hear your thoughts!

## SESSION UPDATE

At its stated meeting on April 22, 2015, the FPC Session:

- Received the monthly church financial report for information;
- Received a report from the pastor for information;
- Discussed at length the status of the manse along with Financial Committee Chair **Lauren Harper**. The manse has been on the market “as-is” for almost a year with several viewings but no buyers. Approved up to \$4000.00 from the Brenner Fund for sanding and two coats of sealant on the manse hardwood floors to assist in marketability. ***These funds will be returned to the Brenner Fund once the manse has sold.*** Sanding and sealing the floors is in addition to the work that has already been done by helpful FPC elves: cleaning and staging the bathrooms, pulling up carpet, and overall cleaning. The **Harper Family** has generously donated the installation of new carpet in the den of the manse (there is no hardwood beneath). It is hoped that these efforts will be sufficient to get the manse sold.
- Discussed at length the quote for repairing the flat roof over the Sunday School wing. Essentially, the roof needs to be replaced, and the estimate is approximately \$14,000.00. There are very few roofers that will work on flat roofs; finding a vendor and obtaining this quote took several months. Approved using Brenner Fund monies to perform this work.
- Confirmed “Art Party” on Friday, May 29th at 5:30 from the Congregational Life Team.
- Christian Formation Team confirmed date to begin sorting, packing, and donating books from the Library in preparation for moving Library to the area off the sanctuary.

### Status of Makemie Woods: Update



At the March 2015 called meeting of the presbytery we voted to move forward with keeping Makemie Woods open for retreats. The management team also promised to monitor the budget carefully.

We continue to work on various possibilities for camping events at Makemie Woods.

Individuals, families, youth, young adults, other adults, scout units, congregations, and clusters of congregations – whether Presbyterian or blended denominations, almost all groups are welcome to use the camp in ways they can imagine beneficial. Makemie Woods is a resource of our presbytery and we are maintaining it for all of us to use.

The Makemie Woods Management Team's plan is to get us through this year of retreats, and then continue with three more years of operation, supporting an outdoor ministry program plus whatever new ideas presbytery might vision. To that end, the first quarter is not so shiny: (1) January was very slow with respect to retreat revenue, (2) February weather was hard on the buildings and systems at the camp, and (3) March was a high energy usage month. However, there are some observations that generate hope: (1) The retreat revenue has picked up and by the end of May we should be back on track or at 50% of our retreat revenue target of \$80,000, and (2) Camp Jordan isn't until July, but it has some promise of being slightly larger event than in past years, (3) Individuals and congregations are pledging. We did not count on those gifts but are so grateful and very appreciative.

And so he sent us mother.

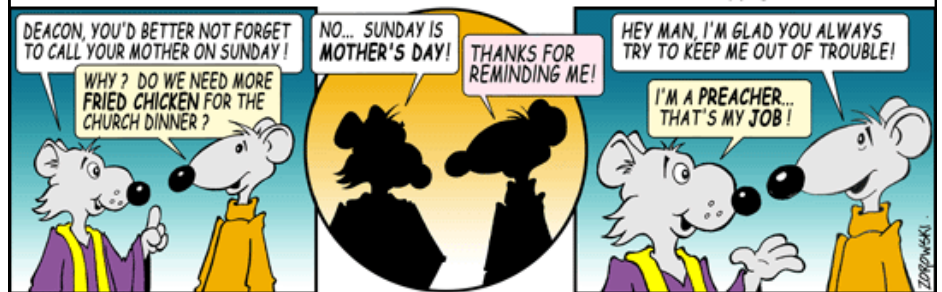
And when our childhood days began,

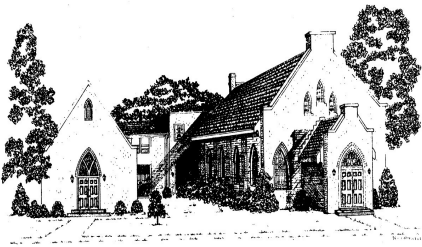
