Theological Questions

Last week's question:

Should a child be given a saint's name at Baptism?

There is an ancient custom among Christians of giving a name at Baptism that is rooted in the Christian faith. Usually this means taking the name of one or more saints (e.g., Joseph, Mary, Andrew), or perhaps a title of the Virgin Mary (Lourdes, Fatima, Guadalupe), or of some virtue (Faith, Hope, Grace). The purpose is to give the person a heavenly patron saint who will pray for the person; but also, to give the person an example of holiness to imitate. As Saint Paul said, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ" (1 Co 11:1).

The Church's Canon Law (canon 855) affirms this custom by stating: "Parents, sponsors, and the pastor are to take care that a name foreign to Christian sensibility is not given."

While the law does not absolutely require that the name be the name of a saint, it gives a common-sense principle that the name of a Christian should not be "foreign" to Christian sensibility. The law does not spell out in great detail what that means, nor does it give examples of names that would be forbidden, but a little familiarity with the faith ("Christian sensibility") will strongly suggest that the name of a baptized person should in some way reflect the faith of Christians. There are so many names from the Old Testament, the New Testament, and Christian history, that parents have abundant examples of Christian heroes to choose from, and with which express the faith.

The sacrament of Baptism is a sacred event, and the choosing of a person's name should involve serious prayer and discernment.




